What data is loaded into MNJAD?

MNJAD receives data primarily from MNCIS Odyssey, the computerized case management system used by Minnesota District Courts to track and manage cases and calendars. The future plan for MNJAD is to receive data from multiple operational systems used throughout the Minnesota Judicial Branch.

MNJAD contains data for many subject areas including but not limited to current and historical cases, charges, placements, judgments, etc. It contains all the data that currently resides in MNCIS Odyssey.

The data is loaded from a copy of MNCIS Odyssey which is made at the end of the day Thursday. *The plan is to have data loaded from a copy that represents data at the end of the day Friday.*

What is the delivery method?

MNJAD puts the extract files on an FTP server owned by the Minnesota Judicial Branch. The customer is provided with an Account ID and Password on that server and it is expected that they pull the data from the server on a timely basis. If the data is not retrieved before the next extract is run, it will be overwritten.
