**IN RE AMENDMENT TO THE RULES OF
THE MINNESOTA CLIENT SECURITY BOARD**

ORDER

The Minnesota Client Security Board filed a petition that recommended the amendment of Rule 3.14(c) of the Rules of the Minnesota Client Security Board to raise the maximum payment amount of a single claim from \$100,000 to \$150,000.

This court solicited public comment on the proposed amendment and is fully advised in the premises,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Rule 3.14(c) of the Rules of the Minnesota Client Security Board is amended to read as follows:
 - c. The maximum amount that may be paid to any claimant for a single claim is ~~\$100,000~~ \$150,000. In exceptional circumstances, the Board may allow a greater or lesser amount based upon the factors set forth in subdivision (b) of this rule.
2. This amendment shall be applicable prospectively and to all unresolved claims filed with the Client Security Board as of the date of this order.


