Order Promulgating and Ratifying
Amendments to the Rules of
Minnesota Board of Continuing
Legal Education

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education has proposed amendments and changes in the form of Rule 106 and amendments to Rule 112 of the Rules of Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education, and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Supreme Court has considered and ratified the actions proposed by the Board as described above,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Rules 106 and 112 shall be amended as follows, effective as of the date of this order:

Rule No. 106. Reporting of Attendance at Approved Courses.


- a. Every lawyer shall submit within 60 days after the close of the period during which his or her educational requirements must be completed an affidavit setting forth all information called for by Form No. 3.
- b. Affidavits received after the 60-day filing period, including affidavits of lawyers who have been granted extensions by the Executive Director or the Board, shall be accompanied by a late filing fee payment of \$25.00 to the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education.
- c. If a lawyer fails to submit an affidavit or submits an affidavit which, on its face, indicates noncompliance with Rule 3 of the Supreme Court Rules for Continuing Legal Education of Members of the Bar, the Executive Director shall send to the lawyer by registered or certified mail directed to his or her last known address or the address currently maintained on the Supreme Court attorney registration records a notice of noncompliance. If a lawyer fails, within 30 days of the mailing of this notice, to submit a proper affidavit he or she will be subject to the procedures of Rule No. 109.

Rule No. 112. Transfer From Restricted Status.

- a. Notice to Executive Director. A lawyer on restricted status who wishes to resume active status shall notify the Executive Director in a writing accompanied by a transfer fee payment of \$100.00 to the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education. Upon receipt of the notice, the Executive Director shall advise the lawyer of his or her transfer requirements. Upon determining that the lawyer has completed those requirements the Executive Director shall notify the Supreme Court.
