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

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**MINNESOTA BOARD OF LEGAL CERTIFICATION
NOTICE OF HEARING**

Notice is hereby given that the Minnesota Board of Legal Certification proposes to designate Real Property as a field of law in which lawyers may be certified as specialists.

The following definition of such specialty field has been tentatively adopted by the Minnesota Board of Legal Certification:

"The specialty field of real property law is the practice of law in Minnesota dealing with matters relating to real property transactions including, but not limited to, real estate conveyances, title searches, leases, condominiums, mortgages and other liens, property taxes, real estate development, real estate financing, and determination of property rights, all with consideration to securities and tax consequences."

An alternate definition of such specialty field has been proposed by the Real Property Section of the Minnesota State Bar Association:


"Real Property law is the practice of law in Minnesota dealing with matters relating to real property transactions including, but not limited to, real estate conveyances, title searches, leases, condominiums, mortgages and other liens, property taxes, real estate development, real estate financing, and determination of property rights."

Also scheduled for public hearing at the same date and time is the application of the Real Property Section of the Minnesota State Bar Association to become an agency authorized to certify attorneys as Real Property specialists.

This joint public hearing will be held on October 24, 1988, at 10:00 A.M., at the offices of the Board of Legal Certification, 200 S. Robert Street, Suite 310, St. Paul, MN, 55107. The hearing is scheduled for the purpose of permitting interested parties to be heard on the matter of the Real Property Section's application. Written or oral comments are invited.

Written comments should be mailed to the office of the Board of Legal Certification at the address shown above. Persons desiring to make comments at the hearing are requested to contact the Board of Legal Certification at the address shown above or by phoning (612)297-1800 no later than five days prior to the hearing.
