The above-entitled matter came on for hearing at the request of the Court for an informal status conference.

Alan Kildow, for Larkin, Hoffman, Daly & Lindgren, appeared on behalf of Plaintiffs. Robert T. Rudy, Hennepin County Attorney, appeared on behalf of Defendants.

The purpose of the conference was for the Court to express its desire that the parties Petition the Supreme Court for assignment of all these cases before one judicial officer.

Having heard the arguments of Counsel, written motions, and on the files and records herein, the Court makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT:

That the above-captioned matter is similar, if not 1. identical to numerous other suits filed in several different district courts alleging property tax overpayments by commercial property owners as a result of the alleged implementation of incorrect tax rates by Defendant counties.

- 2. That the Court is informed that several other cases are yet to be filed.
- 3. That the cases that the Court is aware of are attached in Exhibit A, along with their existing status.
- 4. That Defendants moved this Court for transfer of this action to the Minnesota tax court and has since moved or will move the Minnesota Supreme Court to assign all of the pending cases in the State of Minnesota to the tax court.
- 5. That Plaintiffs desire to have the cases heard in district court by jury trial.
- 6. That Plaintiffs are not opposed to having all of the cases assigned to one district court judge in the State of Minnesota.
- 7. That Plaintiffs have either petitioned the Supreme Court or will petition the Supreme Court for consolidation and/or combination of these cases before a single district court judge.

WHEREFORE, the Court hereby requests of the Chief Judge of the Minnesota Supreme Court, the Honorable Kathleen A. Blatz, or other presiding Judge of the Supreme Court as follows:

- 1. That the Supreme Court assign either one district court judge or one tax court judge to preside over all of the overpayment cases pursuant to Minn. Stat. Section 2.724 and 480.16.
- 2. That if the Supreme Court assigns all the cases to one district court judge, that that judge be empowered to decide

whether or not the cases should be heard in district court or in tax court.
