HOURLY RATE FOR COURT APPOINTED ATTORNEYS IN CASES NOT COVERED BY THE DISTRICT PUBLIC DEFENDERS

The Eighth Judicial District Judges met on May 2, 2014, and considered changing the hourly rate for court appointed attorneys from the current rate of seventy-five dollars (\$75) per hour. This followed a public hearing on the matter held by the Chief Judge of the Eighth Judicial District on April 25, 2014. Receiving notice of the hearing were all law firms, county attorneys, city attorneys, county administrators and public defenders in the Eighth Judicial District. Several individuals appeared and provided information for retaining the current hourly rate and for raising the hourly rate. The last time the hourly rate was raised was on January 1, 2001.

After consideration of all of the information available to them, the Eighth Judicial District Judges determined to raise the hourly rate for all cases involving court appointed attorneys not covered by the Eighth Judicial District Public Defenders office to ninety dollars (\$90.00) per hour for all work performed on or after January 1, 2015. The rate will be raised to one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per hour for all work performed on or after January 1, 2016. The rate of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per hour will apply to all work performed prior to January 1, 2015.

HOURLY RATE FOR COURT APPOINTED ATTORNEYS IN APPELLATE CASES NOT COVERED BY THE DISTRICT PUBLIC DEFENDERS

Minnesota case law and statutes require the Chief Judge of each judicial district to set the hourly rate for all appellate cases involving court appointed attorneys not covered by the District Public Defenders office and paid by the respective county of venue. The Chief Judge of the Eighth Judicial District held a public hearing on this matter, as well as the rate for court appointed attorneys not covered by the District Public Defenders office for district court appointments. Receiving notice of the hearing were all law firms, county attorneys, city attorneys, county administrators and public defenders in the Eighth Judicial District.

After consideration of all of the information available and the input of the Eighth Judicial District Judges, the Chief Judge of the Eighth Judicial District has determined to set the hourly rate for all appellate cases involving court appointed attorneys not covered by the Eighth Judicial District Public Defenders office at ninety dollars (\$90.00) per hour for all work performed on or after January 1, 2015. The rate will be raised to one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per hour for all work performed on or after January 1, 2016. The rate of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per hour will apply to all work performed prior to January 1, 2015.
