2. Preface

This document describes the MNCIS Initial Release Conditions electronic submission service.

See the <u>Integration Services Technical Overview</u> document for additional information on how to use Integration Services.

See the <u>E-Filing Technical Overview</u> document for information that applies to electronic filing services in general.

3. Overview

This service allows an authorized court business partner to submit initial conditions of release to MNCIS, the court case management system. For instance, the jail can use this service to let the court know that the subject has been ordered to post bond and been released. A successful Initial Release Conditions message generates a notification of the conditions that is sent to subscribing agencies. If successful, the release conditions are displayed on the MNCIS Interim Conditions tab and a case event is added to the case. Certain conditions will also cause the case custody flags to be updated.

The Initial Release Conditions Service is just one of the services in the Court Integration Service Catalog. Refer to the Service Catalog list on the <u>Court Integration Services</u> website for a complete list of available services.

4. Messages

The Initial Release Conditions submission service uses the SOAP message structure. See the Integration Services Technical Overview document for more information on the general format for Integration Services messages.

Refer to the <u>CourtXML</u> page link on the <u>Court Integration Services</u> website for the most current version of the schema for this service. That CourtXML schema has the most up to date structure for this submission message.

Sample submission and response messages are available on the Integration Services website.

4.1. Submission Message

The input message to this service is referred to as a *submission* message.

4.1.1. Message Definition

4.1.2. Message Details

Refer to the schema for this service to learn about the data that is included in the submission message, as well as any MNCIS code value enumerations that this service uses.

The allowed conditions are specified by the enumeration of the InterimConditionText element defined in the schema.

This service requires the submitter to include the release order date and at least one condition. There are also several optional elements.

There are certain rules governing the use of the JudgeID element. This element is secured and can only be used if the submitter has had that right granted by the Court. This is because in some counties, a judge orders the conditional release. In some counties the Court and the detention agency will have made prior arrangements to allow conditional release situations to be handled by the detention agency. If that is the case no judge id is entered and the e-filing service will default to a generic administrative judge id.

Message Correlation:

Message correlation functionality may be used with the Initial Release Conditions Service submission messages. This functionality allows the Initial Release Conditions Service message to be submitted with a correlation identifier (in lieu of a case number) that represents a prior e-filed case initiation message. Initial Release Conditions Service messages may only be correlated to case initiating e-files (i.e. complaint, tab charge or citation). Refer to the E-Filing Technical Overview document for information about e-filing correlation functionality.

4.1.3. Message Validation

Some of the validation applied to a submission message, (such as schema validation) is performed by the state Integration Broker (IB), and some validation is performed after the message is submitted from the IB to MNCIS.

It is possible for a submission message to pass schema validation, but fail some business edits enforced by MNCIS.

Some IB validation is common to all query request and e-file submission messages. Refer to the <u>Integration Service Technical Overview</u> document for information on this validation and the resulting SOAP fault errors that can occur.

Some additional validation is common to all e-file submission messages. Refer to the MNCIS <u>E-Filing Technical Overview</u> document for information on this validation and the resulting SOAP fault errors that can occur. This document also provides a high-level message flow diagram for submission messages.

Refer to Appendix A in this document for a list of validation errors that are specific to the Initial Release Conditions Service submission service.

4.2. Response Message

The output message from this service is referred to as a response message.

5.1. Authorization

5.1. Accessing the Service

Initial Release Conditions messages may be submitted as IBM MQ Series messages, or through the use of a web service. Refer to the <u>Integration Services Technical Overview</u> document for information on these methods.

Submission and response messages are retained for a period of time to assist with troubleshooting. The Initial Release Conditions Service adheres to the general message retention policy for submission messages that can be found in the MNCIS <u>E-Filing</u> <u>Technical Overview</u> document.
