ORDER AUTHORIZING DISCLOSURE OF EMPLOYEE HOME ADDRESSES TO LABOR UNION

On December 10, 1999, the Bureau of Mediation Services certified the Minnesota Teamsters Public and Law Enforcement Employees Union, Local No. 320, Minneapolis, Minnesota (referred to herein as "Teamsters Local 320"), as the exclusive representative for the Seventh Judicial District Clerical, Administrative and Technical employees employed by the State of Minnesota, State Court Administrator, who are public employees within the meaning of MINN. STAT. § 179A.03, subd.14, excluding supervisory and confidential employees (referred to herein as the "seventh district bargaining unit"). Teamsters Local 320 desires updates of home addresses of the individuals in the seventh district bargaining unit. Although the Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch generally prohibit public disclosure of an employee's home address, disclosure of home addresses of employees within the seventh district bargaining unit to Teamsters Local 320 is in the interests of the court and necessary to the proper functioning of Teamsters Local 320 in its role as bargaining representative.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the State Court Administrator shall provide the Teamsters Local 320 with a list of home addresses of individuals in the seventh district bargaining unit for use by Teamsters Local 320 solely in its role as bargaining representative. Updates to the address list shall also be provided periodically as determined by the State Court Administrator to reflect changes including but not limited to new employees who qualify as members of the seventh district bargaining unit.
