STATE OF MINNESOTA IN SUPREME COURT

If IE ORDERED that the rules of this court for admission to the bar be, and they are hereby modified with reference to seniors in approved law schools who are entering the armed services of the United States or the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Such a senior will be admitted to the bar of this state without examination upon a certificate of the law school that he has maintained an average in his studies, which if maintained to the end of the school year would entitle him to a diploma in the degree of Bachelor of Laws, and a statement by such law school that in its opinion the candidate is of good moral character and otherwise in every respect qualified for admission to the bar, and that a diploma will be issued to him by the school. In the case of students from the St. Paul College of Law who apply for admission prior to the meeting of the section on legal education of the American Bar Association, to be held February 28, and March 1, 1942, the diploma will not be required. Application for admission shall be made directly to the State Board of Law Examiners on the usual form and the general requirements now in force as to prelegal education and affidavits from two practicing attorneys shall apply. No application fee will be required.
