W IEREAS, the State Board of Law Examiners is charged with the responsibility of administe ing Rules governing the admission of applicants to the Bar of Minnesota,

WHEREAS, the State Board of Law Examiners has recommended that the topic "Secured 'Transactions" (UCC Art. 9) be eliminated from the list of tested topics, as set forth in the Board of Law Examiners' Rule IIIB,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that Rule IIIB of the Rules of the Supreme Court and of the State Board of Law Examiners for Admission to the Bar, which is attache 1 hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby amended, adopted, prescribed and promulgated by this Court.

Rule III. Admission by Examination

- A. Application. An applicant for admission by examination shall file a timely application in the office of the Director accompanied by the information listed in the Rules of the Board and the proper fee.
- B. Scope of Exam. Applicants for admission by examination shall be tested on any combination of the following subjects:

Administrative Law Civil Procedure Constitutional Law Contracts (including UCC Art. 2) Cr.minal Law and Procedure Ethics and Professional Responsibility Ev.dence Family Law (effective for the February, 1993 exam) Federal Individual Income Taxation Partnership, Proprietorship, and Corporations Real Property Torts Uniform Commercial Code, Art. 1, 2, 9 Wills, Estates and Trusts
