IN RE AMENDMENT TO THE RULES OF THE MINNESOTA CLIENT SECURITY BOARD

ORDER

The Minnesota Client Security Board filed a petition that recommended the amendment of Rule 3.14(c) of the Rules of the Minnesota Client Security Board to raise the maximum payment amount of a single claim from \$100,000 to \$150,000.

This court solicited public comment on the proposed amendment and is fully advised in the premises,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. Rule 3.14(c) of the Rules of the Minnesota Client Security Board is amended to read as follows:
 - c. The maximum amount that may be paid to any claimant for a single claim is \$100,000 \$150,000. In exceptional circumstances, the Board may allow a greater or lesser amount based upon the factors set forth in subdivision (b) of this rule.
- 2. This amendment shall be applicable prospectively and to all unresolved claims filed with the Client Security Board as of the date of this order.
