effective July 1, 2008.

services provided on or after July 1, 2008.

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RULES OF THE MINNESOTA STATE BOARD OF CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION

Rule 2. Definitions

In these Rules,

* * *

- R. "Pro bono legal representation" means providing legal representation to a probono client without compensation, expectation of compensation, or other direct or indirect pecuniary gain.
- S. "Pro bono client" means an individual, not a corporation or other organizational entity, who has been referred to the lawyer by a legal services provider.

T. "Legal services provider" means (1) a legal services organization funded by the Legal Services Corporation, or (2) the Children's Law Center of Minnesota.

Rule 6. Special Categories of Credit

* * *

D. Pro Bono Legal Representation. A lawyer may claim one (1) hour of standard CLE credit for every six (6) hours of pro bono legal representation that the lawyer provides to a pro bono client in a legal matter that has been referred to the lawyer by a legal services provider. No more than six (6) hours of credit may be claimed per reporting period by a lawyer for pro bono legal representation. In order to receive CLE credit the lawyer must submit an Affidavit of Pro Bono Representation to the Board (see Appendix III).
