In Re Judicial Transfer and Vacancy Tenth Judicial District

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 2.722, subdivision 4 (1988) the Supreme Court is authorized to continue, abolish, or transfer judicial positions which are vacated upon the death, resignation, retirement or removal from office of incumbent judges after consultation with judges and attorneys in the affected judicial district, and,

WHEREAS, the retirement of the Honorable Phyllis G. Jones, presently chambered in Anoka County, creates a vacancy in the Tenth Judicial District effective May 31, 1993; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 480.22 the Supreme Court is empowered to designate the location of chambers for judges;

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has received a request from the Honorable James D. Gibbs, the Chief Judge of the Tenth Judicial District, that the chambers of the Honorable Gabriel D. Giancola be moved from Elk River in Sherburne County to Anoka in Anoka County; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has considered the weighted caseload information regarding the relative judicial needs of the Tenth Judicial District;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The vacancy occasioned by the retirement of the Honorable Phyllis G. Jones in Anoka County shall be filled by the Honorable Gabriel D. Giancola, thereby creating a vacancy in Sherburne County at Elk River.
- 2. The vacancy in Sherburne County shall be, and hereby is, certified to the Governor to be filled in the manner provided by law.
- 3. The Honorable Gabriel D. Giancola's transfer of chambers location shall become effective upon the Governor's appointment of the Sherburne County judge.
