ORDER

In Re Judicial Vacancy **Tenth Judicial District**

WHEREAS, an additional judgeship was authorized for the Tenth Judicial District by 1999 Minn. Laws Chap. 216, Art 1, Sec. 4 effective January 1, 2001;

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has consulted with the Conference of Chief Judges, the Chief Judge of the Tenth Judicial District and the State Court Administrator regarding the chamber location of this judgeship;

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has received a request from the Honorable Sharon Hall of the Tenth Judicial District that her chambers be moved from Elk River in Sherburne County to Anoka, in Anoka County:

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has considered the weighted caseload information regarding the relative judicial needs of the Tenth Judicial District and the views of the Tenth Judicial District judges;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The new judgeship created by Minn. Laws Chap. 216, Art. 1, Sec. 4 effective January 1, 2001 be and hereby is certified to the Governor to be chambered in Elk River in Sherburne County and be filled in the manner provided by law; and
- 2. The chambers of the Honorable Sharon Hall be, and hereby are, moved from Sherburne County to Anoka County effective upon the assumption of office by the person appointed to fill the new judgeship in Sherburne County which becomes effective January 1, 2001.
