ORDER ESTABLISHING MINNESOTA SUPREME COURT JUVENILE JUSTICE SERVICES TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, in 1992 the Minnesota Supreme Court established the Juvenile Justice System Task Force for the purpose of making recommendations regarding legislative and judicial system changes that would allow a better system-wide response to serious and repeat juvenile crime;

WHEREAS, since the 1994 issuance of the Juvenile Justice System Task Force Report Minnesota has experienced an increase in the number of delinquency and status offense case filings;

WHEREAS, a review of delinquency and status offense statistics reveals that the families and juveniles served by the justice system community has shifting and diverse program needs, and that numerous programs have been developed over the years to address those needs; and

WHEREAS, the 1997 Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee recognized the need to identify and coordinate services available to families involved in delinquency and status offense cases;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1. The Minnesota Supreme Court Juvenile Justice Services Task Force is hereby established for the purpose of:
 - (a) Identifying in designated counties the existing services and collaboratives available to address the needs of families involved in delinquency and status offense cases;
 - (b) Identifying gaps and overlaps regarding services and collaboratives on a statewide basis;
 - (c) Identifying barriers to improved collaboration on a statewide basis;
 - (d) Developing model protocols to provide optimum service statewide;
 - (e) Developing outcome measures by which the effectiveness of juvenile services programs can be monitored;
 - (f) Making recommendations regarding service gaps, overlaps, and barriers to coordinated services:
 - (g) Developing a uniform list of possible Out-of-Home Placement goals for juvenile court dispositions from which judges could select when complying with Minn. Stat. § 260.181, subd. 3; and
 - (h) Identifying steps required by state agencies to collect and report summary information on the achievement of the established goals.

- 2. On or before September 1, 2000, the Task Force shall submit to the court its final report and recommendations.
- 3. Justice Joan Lancaster is hereby designated as Chair of the Juvenile Justice Services Task Force.
- 4. Melissa B. Garlington, Project Specialist for State Court Administration, is hereby designated as staff for the Juvenile Justice Services Task Force.
