IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the petition be, and the same is, denied. The record demonstrates that the Bar Association and a number of its individual members are deeply committed to the continued development and maintenance of a comprehensive program designed to provide assistance and support to lawyers in need of such assistance. We encourage the Bar Association to continue its efforts, concentrating on a program based upon voluntary contributions.
