Order Establishing Supreme Court Advisory Committee on Lawyer Discipline.

WHEREAS the Minnesota State Bar Association has filed a petition supported by Resolution of the Lawyers Professional Responsibility Board, requesting the court to establish a committee "to study the lawyer discipline process, procedures and operations of the Minnesota Lawyers Professional Responsibility Board, to report the results of the study to the Court and the Bar, and, if changes are deemed needed, to recommend such changes for the consideration of the Court,"

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that a 9-member committee designated as the Supreme Court Advisory Committee on Lawyer Discipline be, and hereby is, established to carry out the responsibilities stated in the Petition of the Minnesota State Bar Association and quoted in this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the membership of the committee be composed of six attorneys admitted to the practice of law in the State of Minnesota and three non-lawyer members.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Minnesota State Bar Association recommend to this Court for appointment to the committee six persons, four of whom shall be lawyers,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon receipt of member recommendations from the Minnesota State Bar Association, that this Court appoint the recommended members and three other persons, two of whom shall be lawyers, to the committee and appoint a chairperson for the committee from the committee membership.
