

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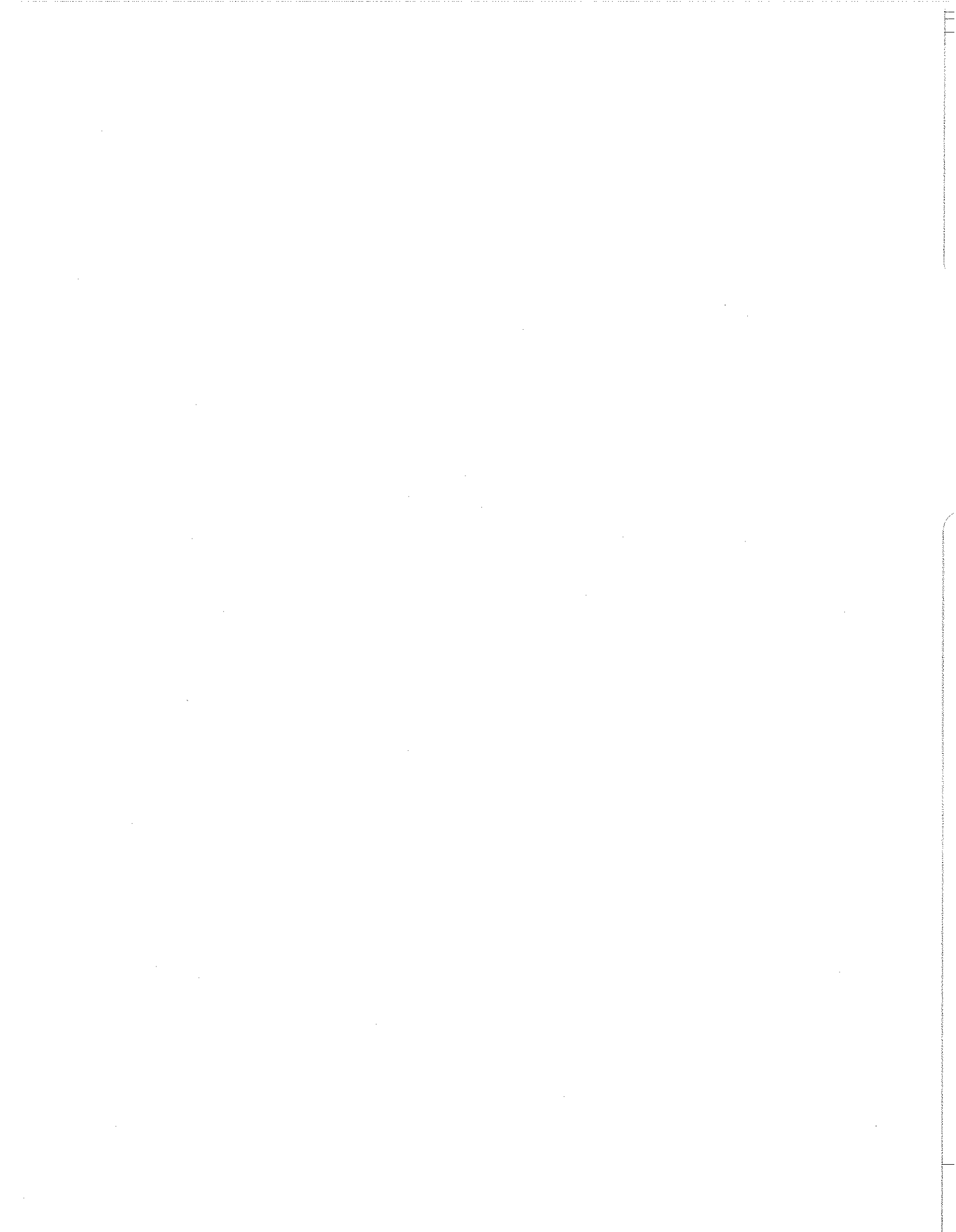

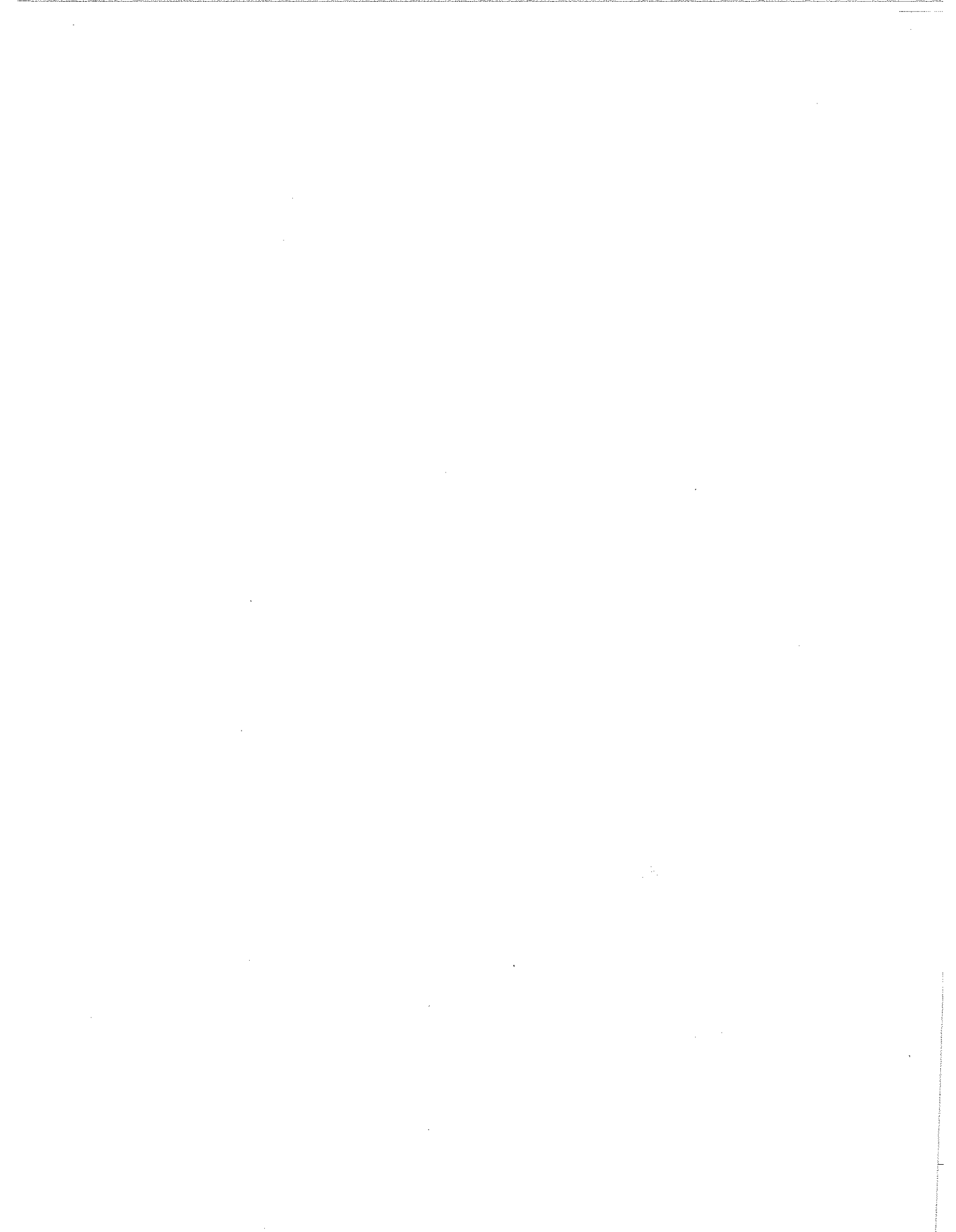

**Britton Congressional Plan Elements**

The Britton, *et al.* Congressional Plan is based upon the theory that Minnesota has one large, primarily agricultural district (proposed District 7), one primarily mining, forestry and recreational district (District 8), two (2) exurban districts (District 2 and

District 6), two (2) urban/suburban districts, one centered around the City of Minneapolis (District 5) and the other centered around the City of St. Paul (proposed District 4) and one western suburban/exurban district comprised of the suburban communities west of Minneapolis and along the Interstate 94/Northstar Corridor Route (District 3). It is respectfully submitted that each of these areas have their own distinctive community of interest which, while not necessarily totally the same on all issues, nevertheless are distinct from each other.

That theory, together with the requirement for absolute population equality in congressional districts, is the driving force behind this plan. It was drawn without reference to incumbency or political data. It also takes into account the demographic changes in Minnesota that have occurred over the past ten years.

### The Districts

#### Congressional District 1

Congressional District 1 needed to add population. Its 2010 population was 644,787 and therefore needed to add an additional 18,203 people in order to achieve equality. In addition, the demographics of the extreme westerly part of the district more closely match that of Congressional District 7 with its fertile agricultural land and without very large cities. In short, a rural and agricultural district.

This district is significantly the same as the district created by the Special Redistricting Panel in its Final Order dated March 19, 2002 in *Zachman, et al. v. Kiffmeyer, et al.*, Court File No. CO-01-160.

Those districts and the districts proposed by the Britton plan filed herewith, include the following whole counties: Blue Earth, Dodge, Faribault, Fillmore, Freeborn, Houston, Mower, Nicollet, Olmstead, Wabasha, Steele, Waseca, Watonwan, Winona.

This proposed plan deletes from Congressional District 1 and adds to proposed Congressional District 7 the following entire counties: Brown, Cottonwood, Jackson, Martin, Murray, Nobles, Pipestone, and Rock. All of these eight counties, in their entirety are added to Congressional District 7 with which they have a much closer agricultural community of interest.

In order to make up for the transfer of these eight counties, the Britton plan adds the entire counties of Goodhue and Rice. These counties were selected because they are immediately north of the east side of Congressional District 1 and have more in common with the remainder of Congressional District 1 than do the eight deleted counties.

The only counties split in the creation of Congressional District 1 are:

1. Le Sueur County. This county had also been split by the Zachman Panel. The only part of Le Sueur County that is not in Congressional District 1 is a part of the City of New Prague which is more exurban than rural. Therefore it is in District 2.
2. Dakota. Northfield City in its entirety has been added to District 1 in order to balance the district population and to keep the city whole.

Congressional District 1 under the Britton plan remains a southern Minnesota district but with a recognition that it has more in common geographically, economically and socially, with its northern neighbors of Goodhue, Rice and Le Sueur than with its extreme westerly components. It remains focused on Interstate 90 and also remains an east-west district.

### Congressional District 2

Congressional District 2 was too large with the 2010 population of 732,515. It therefore needed to transfer out 69,524 people.

As in the Plan adopted by the Special Redistricting Panel in *Zachman v. Kiffmeyer*, *supra*, Final Order dated March 19, 2002, the Britton plan includes the whole counties

of Scott and Carver, which were two of the fastest growing counties in the state during the last decade and which comprise the core of Congressional District 2.

The Britton plan transfers to Congressional District 1 the whole counties of Rice and Goodhue because they and Le Sueur County are all outside of the eleven county metropolitan area and are really not yet exurban. Furthermore, their ties are more directly to the south with Congressional District 1. The only exception is the City of Northfield.

The proposed plan adds to Congressional District 2, in order to make up for the loss of Rice and Goodhue, the counties of Meeker, McLeod, Renville, Sibley and Kandiyohi because they are more closely tied to the Scott County – Carver County core of Congressional District 2 than they are to the agricultural districts along the western border of the state which is proposed as Congressional District 7.

The only split counties in proposed Congressional District 2 are:

1. Le Sueur, which contributes only a portion of the City of New Prague to Congressional District 2, with the rest remaining with Congressional District 1. The portion of New Prague that is transferred to Congressional District 2 is that which abuts Scott County.
2. Wright County, which is divided between proposed Congressional District 2 and proposed Congressional District 3 by deleting Clearwater City,

Clearwater Township, Silver Creek Township, Monticello City, Monticello Township and Otsego from Congressional District 2 and placing them in proposed Congressional District 3. Congressional District 2 was simply too big.

3. Rockford and St. Michael are split between Congressional Districts 2 and 3 simply because 15 more people were needed to achieve population equality and one census block was found in St. Michael with precisely that population.
4. Dakota, which contributes the most exurban and rural southern portions of that county which are more closely aligned with eastern Scott County than they are with the southern suburbs of St. Paul that are in proposed as Congressional District 4. This proposal divides Dakota County between Congressional Districts 2 and 4 but keeps Washington County intact.

Proposed Congressional District 2 is an exurban district with the exception of Meeker, Renville and Kandiyohi counties, but it is respectfully submitted that those counties are more closely aligned with the southwestern exurban part of the Twin Cities than they are with the wonderful agricultural district ranging from the Canadian border to the Iowa border.

### Congressional District 3

Congressional District 3 surprisingly needed to gain population from its census figure of 650,185. That is an indication that this district did not gain population as fast as its southerly neighbor (Congressional District 2) or its easterly neighbor (Congressional District 6).

Proposed Congressional District 3 therefore is a suburban district comprised of (a) Anoka County suburbs in the northeast, (b) Hennepin County suburbs in the middle, and (c) Wright County suburbs in the northwest. It is entirely within the eleven county metropolitan area and includes only the most suburban (not exurban or rural) parts of those three counties.

To the old Congressional District 3, the Britton plan adds the following:

1. Anoka City in its entirety.
2. All of Coon Rapids, which was previously split.
3. All of Ramsey City.
4. One-third of Andover City.
5. All of the northern and western suburbs of Hennepin County.
6. One census block of Nowthen City to achieve population equality.



The Britton plan retains as part of Congressional District 3 the following whole cities:

1. Brooklyn Center
2. Brooklyn Park
3. Champlain
4. Corcoran
5. Dayton
6. Deephaven
7. Eden Prairie
8. Excelsior
9. Greenfield
10. Greenwood City
11. Hassan
12. Hopkins – which is now made whole and no longer split
13. Independence
14. Long Lake
15. Loretto
16. Maple Grove City
17. Maple Plain City
18. Medicine Lake
19. Medina
20. Minnetonka City
21. Minnetonka Beach

22. Minnetrista
23. Mound
24. Orono
25. Osseo
26. Plymouth
27. Rogers
28. Shorewood
29. Spring Park City
30. St. Bonifacius City
31. Tonka Bay City
32. Wayzata City
33. Woodland City

Edina has been divided between proposed Congressional Districts 3 and 5 instead of dividing Hopkins as in the *Zachman* Panel's 2002 decision, because Hopkins is smaller and therefore more homogeneous than Edina. It also seems more rational to keep the smaller city intact. Second, Hopkins is more closely paired with Minnetonka than with St. Louis Park. The Hopkins Minnetonka pairing also more closely follows the school district lines.

Proposed Congressional District 3 also adds the following portions of Wright County in their entirety:

1. Albertville
2. Clearwater City
3. Clearwater Township
4. Hanover City
5. Monticello City
6. Monticello Township
7. Otsego
8. Rockford City
9. Silver Creek Township

It also includes parts of St. Michael City and Rockford Township.

#### Congressional District 4

This Congressional District shows a deviation from the ideal population of 48,367 people and needs to grow significantly.

The Britton plan proposes to keep Ramsey County wholly intact and to add to its population (508,640 people) the City of St. Anthony and such of the northerly suburbs of Dakota County that are necessary to achieve population equality as follows:

1. All of Inver Grove Heights – which would no longer be split.
2. Lilydale (already in CD4)
3. Mendota City (already in CD4)

4. Mendota Heights (already in CD4)
5. South St. Paul (already in CD4)
6. West St. Paul (already in CD4)
7. Sunfish Lake (to be added)

The plan would also add most of Eagan which is closely tied to the above St. Paul suburbs, i.e., all of Eagan east of Highway 3 and south of 110<sup>th</sup> Street. The east boundary is the Eagan City line. This portion of Eagan is deleted only to balance the population of Congressional District 4.

The proposed plan deletes all of Washington County from Congressional District 4 so that county would no longer be split.

Thus, the proposal is for a Ramsey County, Dakota County district with St. Anthony, which is most closely associated with Ramsey County, added.

The district does not include any portion of the City of Minneapolis. There is simply no logical or legal reason to do so.

## Congressional District 5

This is the Congressional District that includes all of the City of Minneapolis (382,578 people) and the following suburbs of that city:

1. Bloomington
2. Richfield (already in CD5)
3. St. Louis Park (already in CD5)
4. Golden Valley (already in CD5)
5. Fort Snelling Unorganized (already in CD5)
6. New Hope (already in CD5)
7. Crystal (already in CD5)
8. Robbinsdale (already in CD5)

It also includes the adjacent parts of Edina that are needed to achieve population equality.

The plan deletes all parts of Anoka County and all parts of Ramsey County that are currently in Congressional District 5 and also deletes all parts of Hopkins (transferred to proposed CD3) which will therefore no longer be split.

This is truly a Minneapolis and suburban district.

## Congressional District 6

This is the congressional district that has grown the fastest with the 2010 census population of 759,478 requiring that it lose 96,487 people in order to achieve population equality.

In order to accomplish that requirement, the Britton plan proposes that:

1. Congressional District 6 drop all of its population of Ramsey County (i.e., Blaine) into Congressional District 4.
2. Congressional District 6 lose all of its population of Hennepin County (Hanover and Rockford) into Congressional District 3.
3. Congressional District 6 lose all of its Wright County population because that county's population has more in common with its neighbors in Congressional District 2 on its southern boundary and with Congressional District 3 on its eastern boundary than it has with Washington and Anoka Counties which form the core of proposed Congressional District 6. The statements made by the Assistant Wright County Attorney at the hearing on open issues confirms this proposal.
4. This Congressional District retain all of its population in Benton and Sherburne counties.
5. Congressional District 6 acquire all of the population of Washington County, thus no longer splitting that county (238,136 people).

6. That it acquire most all of Anoka County.

Thus, the district would become a Washington, Benton, Sherburne, most of Anoka (northerly part) and part of Stearns. This would reduce it from eight counties down to five.

St. Joseph City and St. Joseph Township have both been split. This is proposed to avoiding splitting Waite Park and the St. Cloud metropolitan area. The particular lines chosen for the split reflect municipal boundaries and attempt to account for the fact that if Interstate 94 were used as the boundary, population equality would not be achieved.

The Britton Plaintiffs are fully aware of the public testimony of some Washington County residents that they would prefer to be added to a congressional district with Ramsey County than to remain with Benton, Sherburne, Stearns and Wright counties. The problem with that approach is that Washington County, when added to Ramsey County, is too big (746,776 people). Thus either Washington County or Ramsey County would have to be needlessly split. Under the Britton proposal, neither Ramsey nor Washington County would be split. A second negative consequence of adopting the concept of adding Washington County to Ramsey County would be that Congressional District 4 would have to sever its historic ties to Dakota County (i.e., West St. Paul, South St. Paul, Mendota Heights and Inver Grove Heights) which would gain nothing. It is submitted that those suburbs have more in common with St.

Paul than does Washington County. However, the concerns of those Washington County citizens who spoke have been heard. As a consequence, the Britton Plaintiffs propose to detach Wright County from Congressional District 6.

Congressional District 7

This primarily agricultural district requires a population gain of 37,479 people in order to achieve population equality. It is this district which suggests more changes from the current configuration than any of the other districts.

The first proposed change is that the following counties, in their entirety, be added to current Congressional District 7:

Rock	9,687
Nobles	21,378
Jackson	10,266

The reason for this proposal is because those eight counties in the extreme southwestern corner of the state have more in common as quality agricultural land with the counties north of them than they do with the counties east of them. This is and should remain an agricultural congressional district. Furthermore, those eight counties should not be split off from those counties north of them with a similar agricultural interest even though it extends to the Canadian border. On the other hand, the counties east of these eight have larger urban oriented areas and cities (e.g. Albert Lea, Austin, Rochester, Owatonna, etc.).

Second, as a consequence of the addition of those eight counties, Congressional District 7 would have to lose population on its eastern border. The Britton proposal is that the counties of Renville, Kandiyohi, Meeker, McLeod and Sibley be added to Congressional District 2. Sibley, McLeod and Meeker all abut the eleven county metropolitan area and certainly have more in common with Scott, Carver and Wright than they do with the northwestern corner of the State of Minnesota. Similarly, Kandiyohi County and Renville County, which border Sibley, McLeod and Meeker, are tied to those counties by Highways 12 and 212. Those east-west transportation corridors tie together this entire central part of the state. Kandiyohi and Renville certainly are not tied to those counties that form the western border of Minnesota.

Beltrami County remains split under the Britton proposal but a greater portion of its population is moved into Congressional District 8. In addition, a good faith attempt

has been made to keep as many Native American areas in the same congressional district as possible. Thus Beltrami is divided along the eastern border of the Red Lake Reservation. All of the main parts of Red Lake and White Earth are in District 7. The City of Bemidji remains undivided. Northern Township (Precinct 2 and most of Precinct 1) is split in order to achieve population equality.

Finally, Stearns County is divided between Congressional District 7 and Congressional District 6 in a manner similar to the division ordered by the Special Redistricting Panel in *Zachman v. Kiffmeyer, supra*, Court File No. CO-01-160, but modified to achieve population equality. The main divisions are within the City of St. Joseph, St. Joseph Township and Nowthen Township. Congressional District 7 includes all of precinct 2 of Nowthen and a part of precinct 1. Most of St. Joseph Township and one precinct of the City of St. Joseph are in Congressional District 7 to achieve population equality. They were selected in order to keep all of the St. Cloud metropolitan area in a single congressional district.

#### Congressional District 8

This district needs to pick up only 2,649 more people in order to achieve population equality. Therefore, the Britton plan continues to keep the counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cass, Chisago, Cook, Crow Wing, Hubbard, Isanti, Itasca, Kanabec, Koochiching,

Lake, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Pine, St. Louis and Wadena all whole and all in the same congressional district.

The only significant change is to expand Congressional District 8 further into Beltrami County to add the additional population necessary for equality and to make a good faith effort to keep Native American reservations intact and not split.

Simply put, this district is an Iron Range, Duluth, Arrowhead and Mille Lacs area district. There is no need or reason to change it.

## CONCLUSION

The proposed Congressional districts were all created “incumbent blind,” without reference to residences. They were also created without attention to voting patterns but are believed to reflect the political makeup of each district. They do not violate any portion of the Voting Rights Act. Finally, each district reflects the varying interests of their inhabitants. The Britton Plaintiffs respectfully submit this Plan in the belief that it creates districts that are an accurate reflection of the current and changing interests of each part of the state. The Britton Plaintiffs are very proud of this Plan and submit it for the Panel’s consideration.

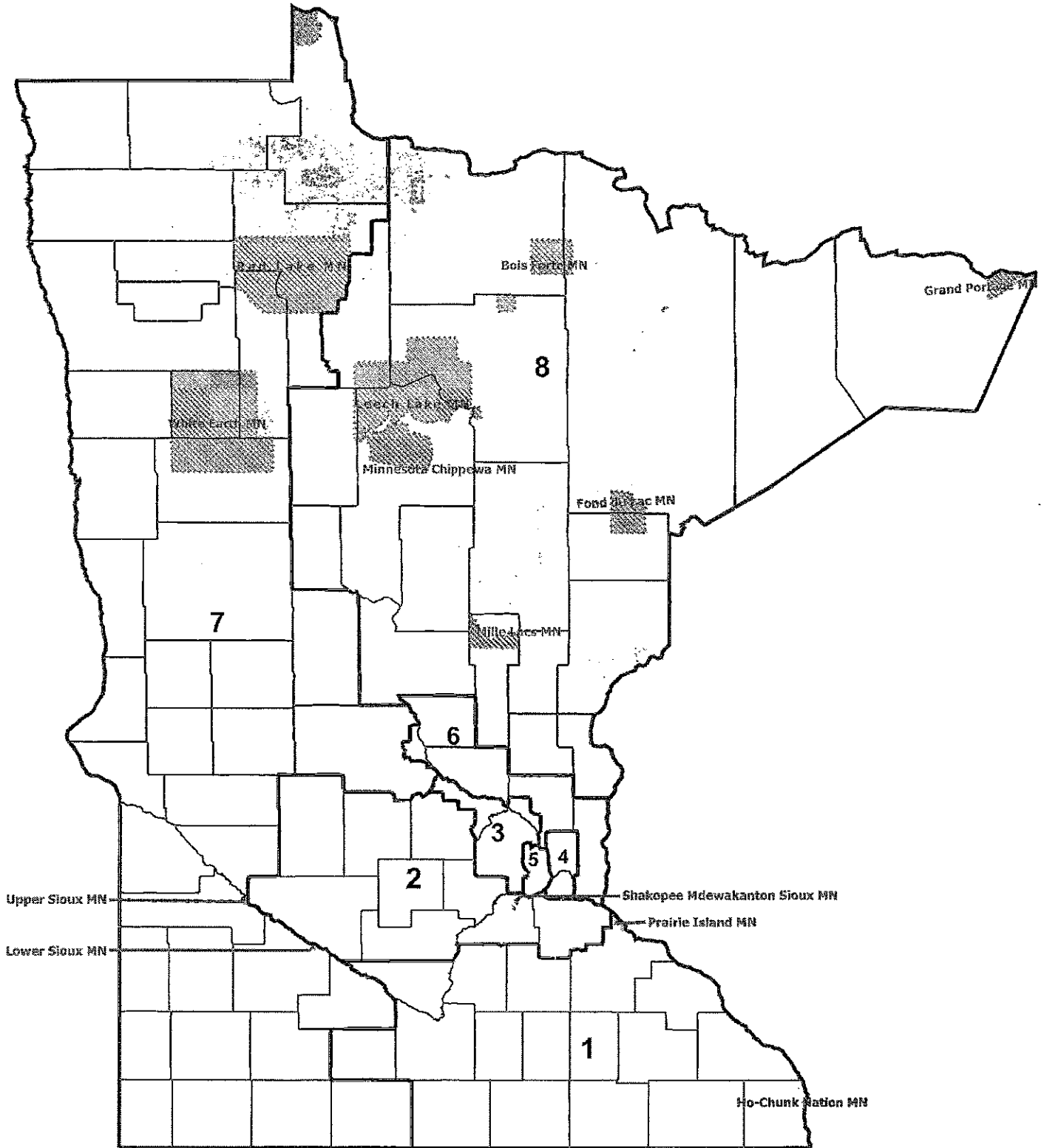

## State Map



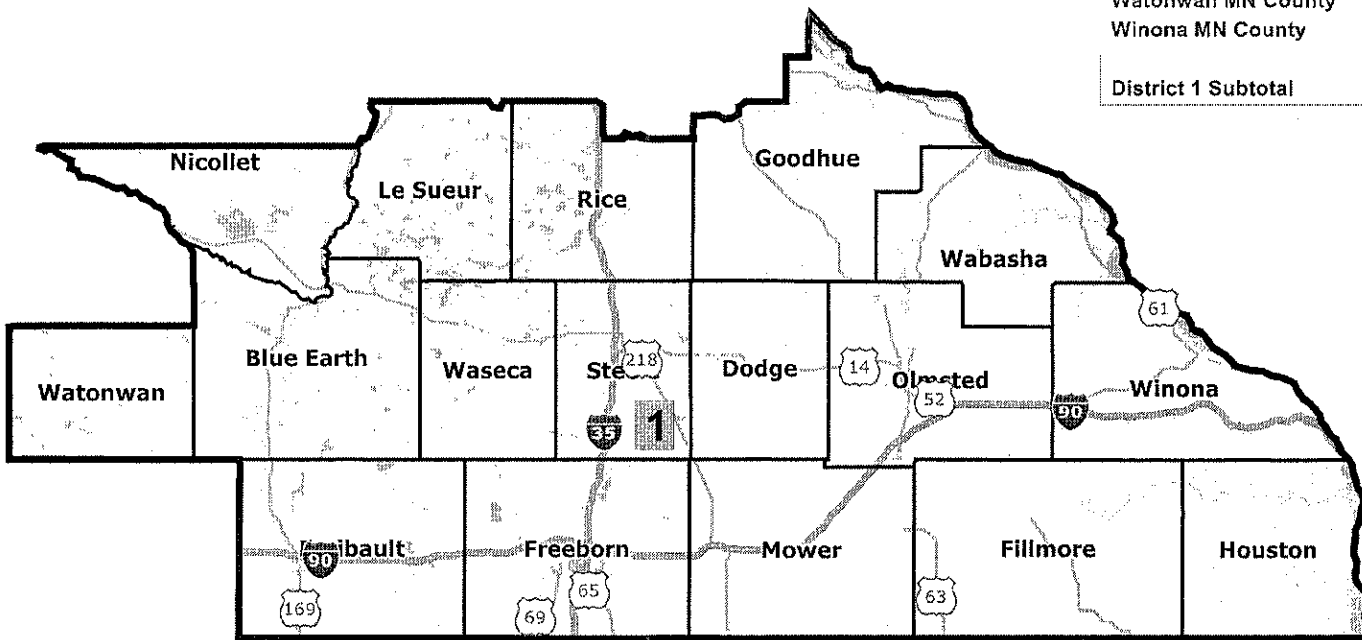

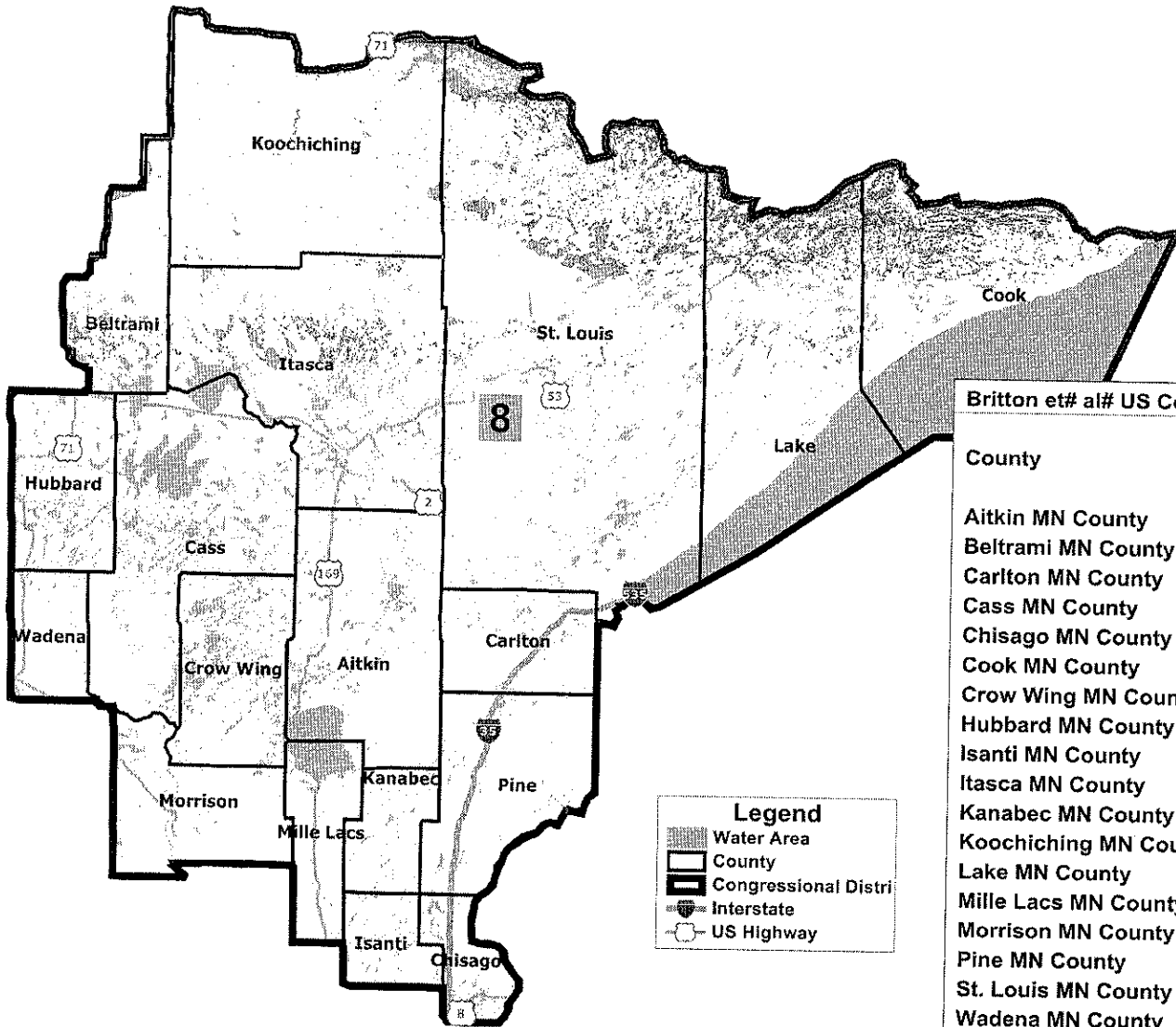

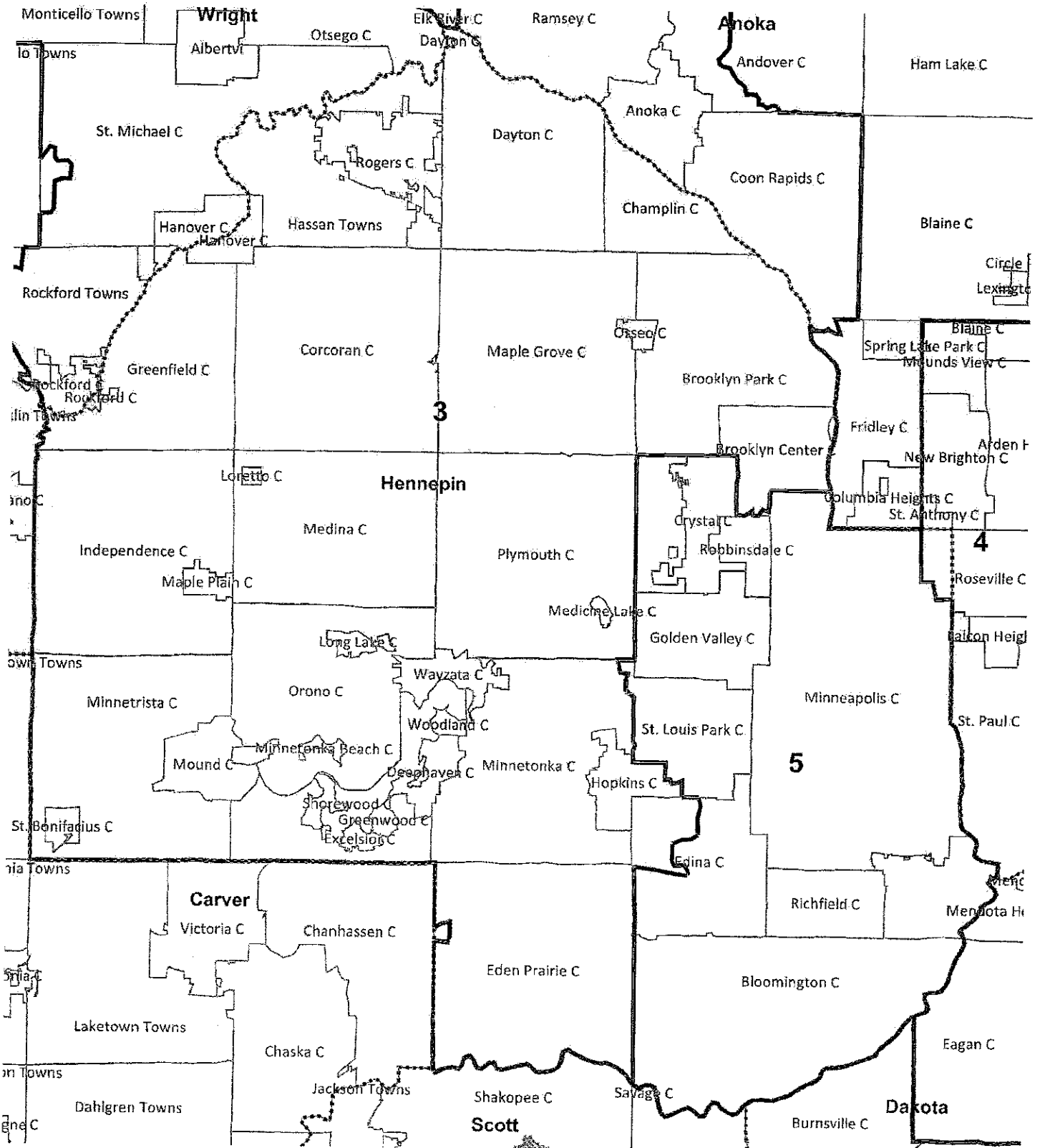


# Britton et al Congressional Plan County Split - Beltrami



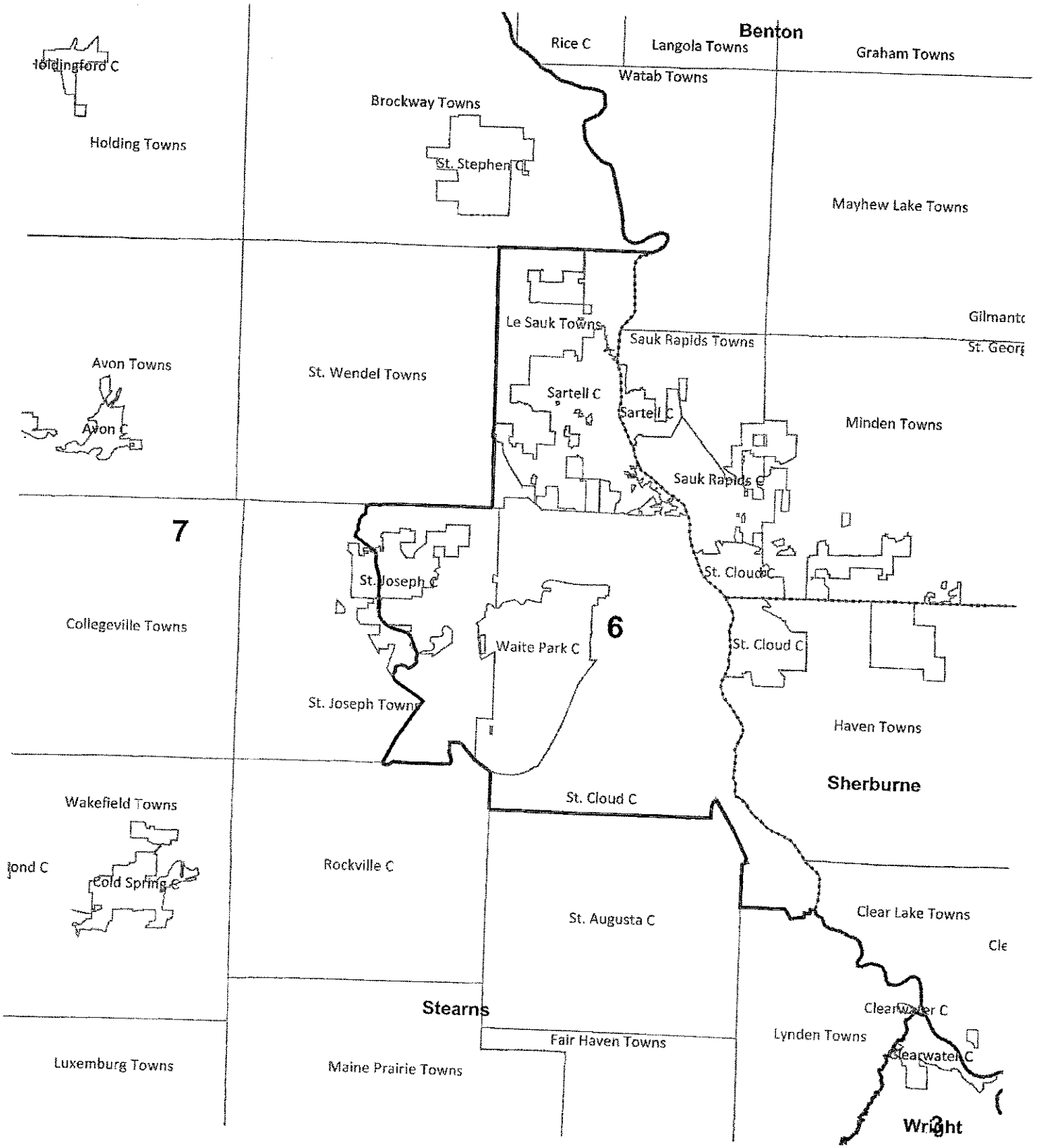

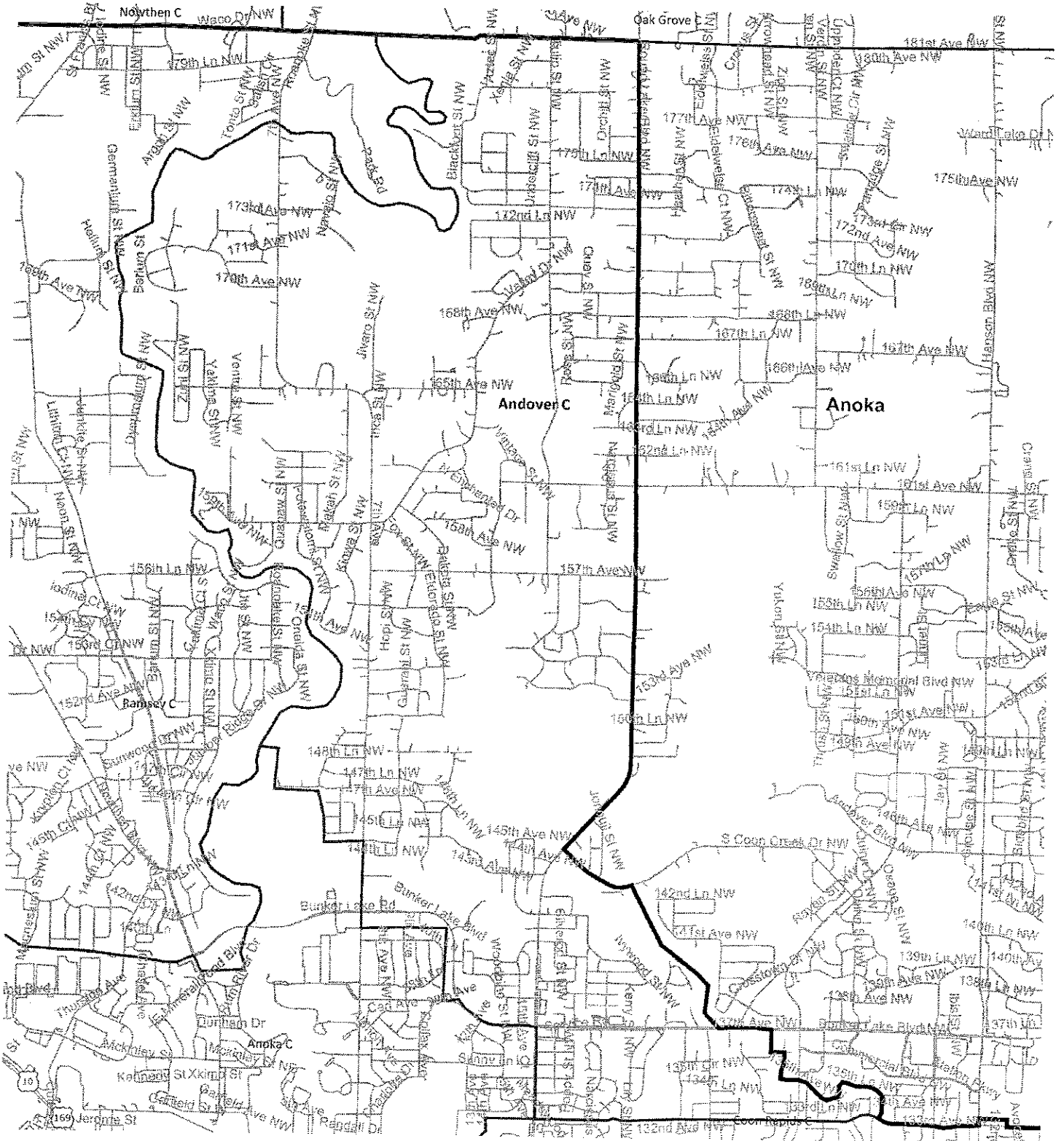

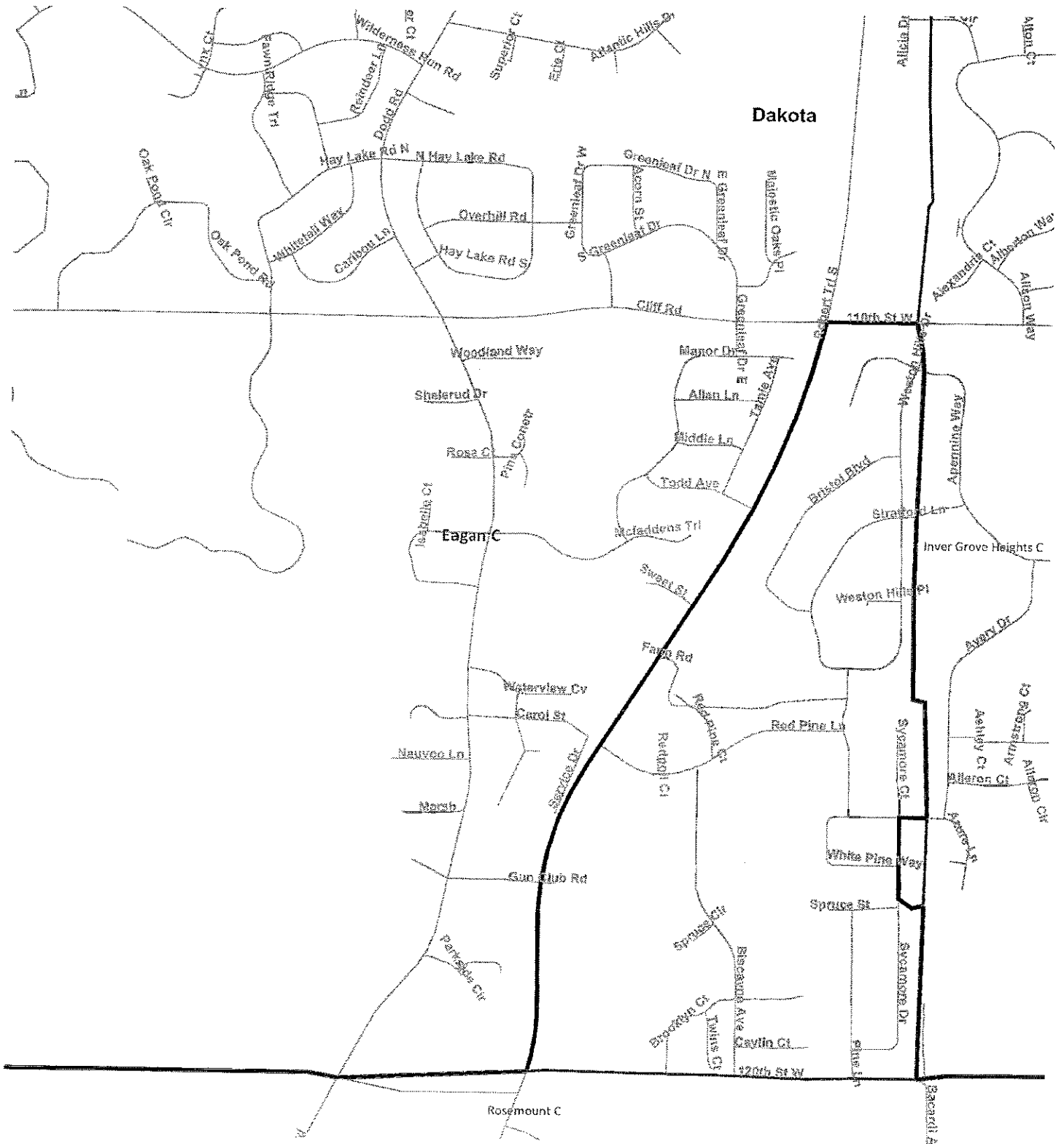


# Britton et al Congressional Plan City Split - Andover (Anoka)

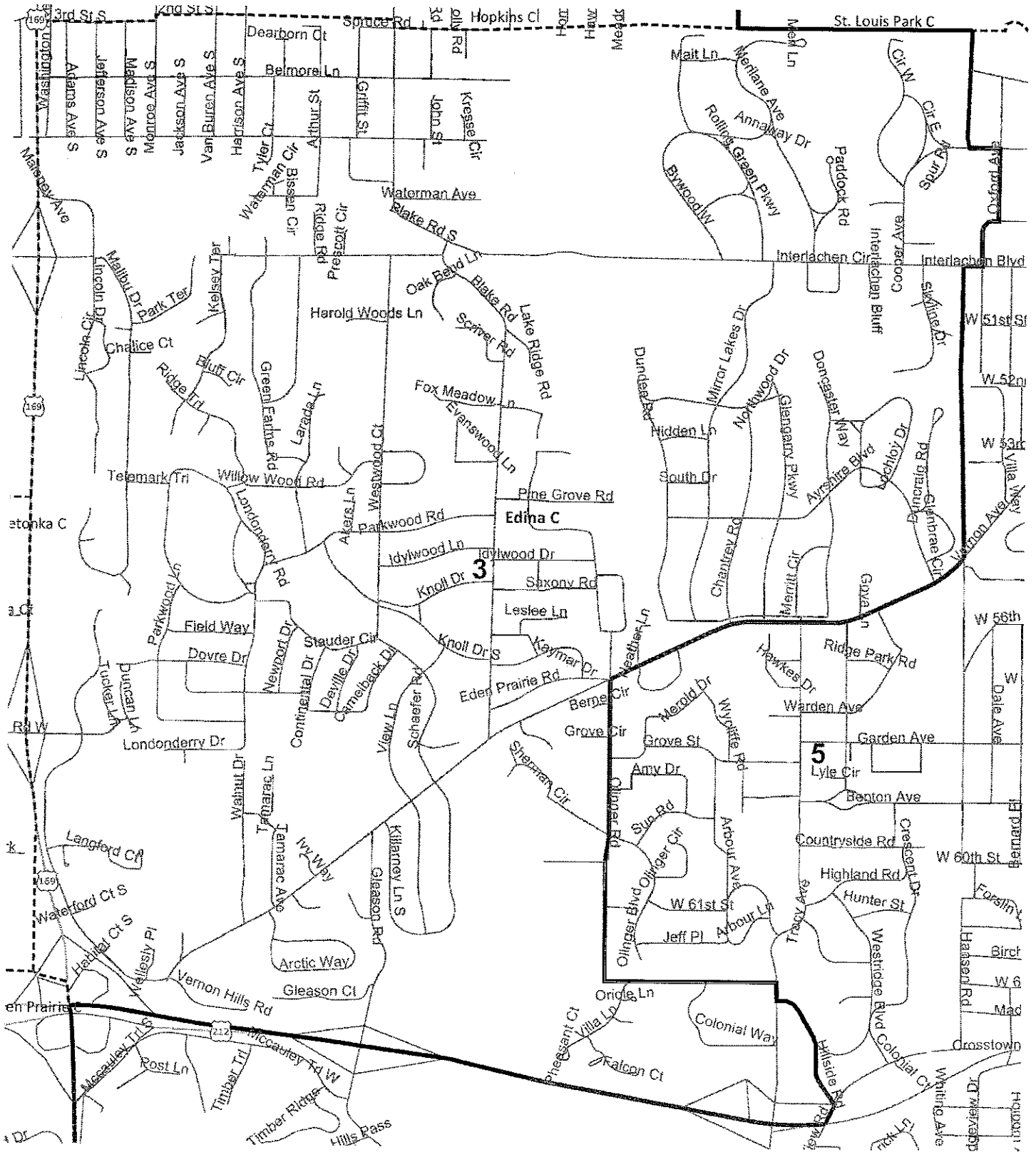




# Britton et al Congressional Plan City Split - Eagan (Dakota)

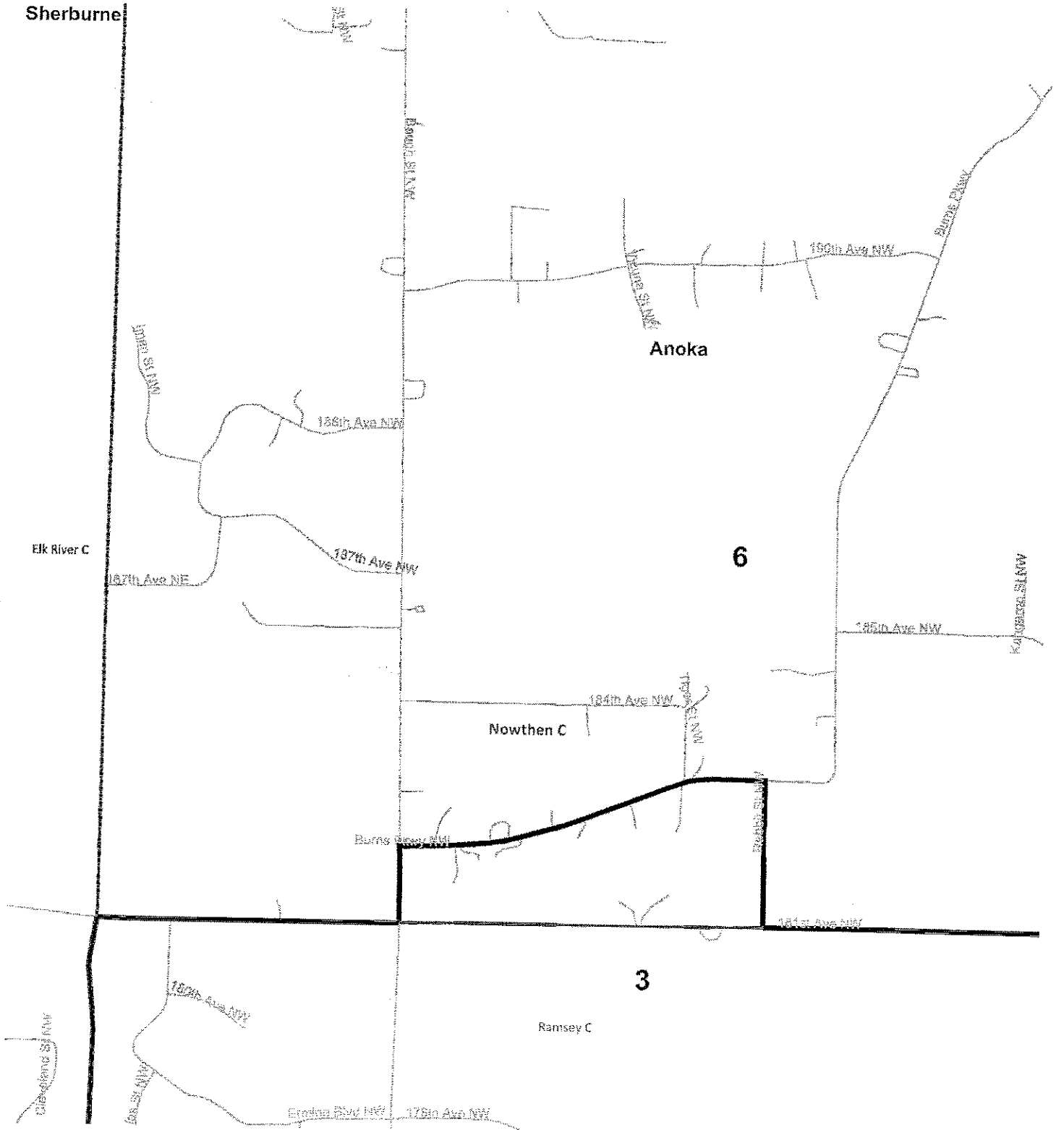


# Britton et al Congressional Plan City Split - Edina (Hennepin)



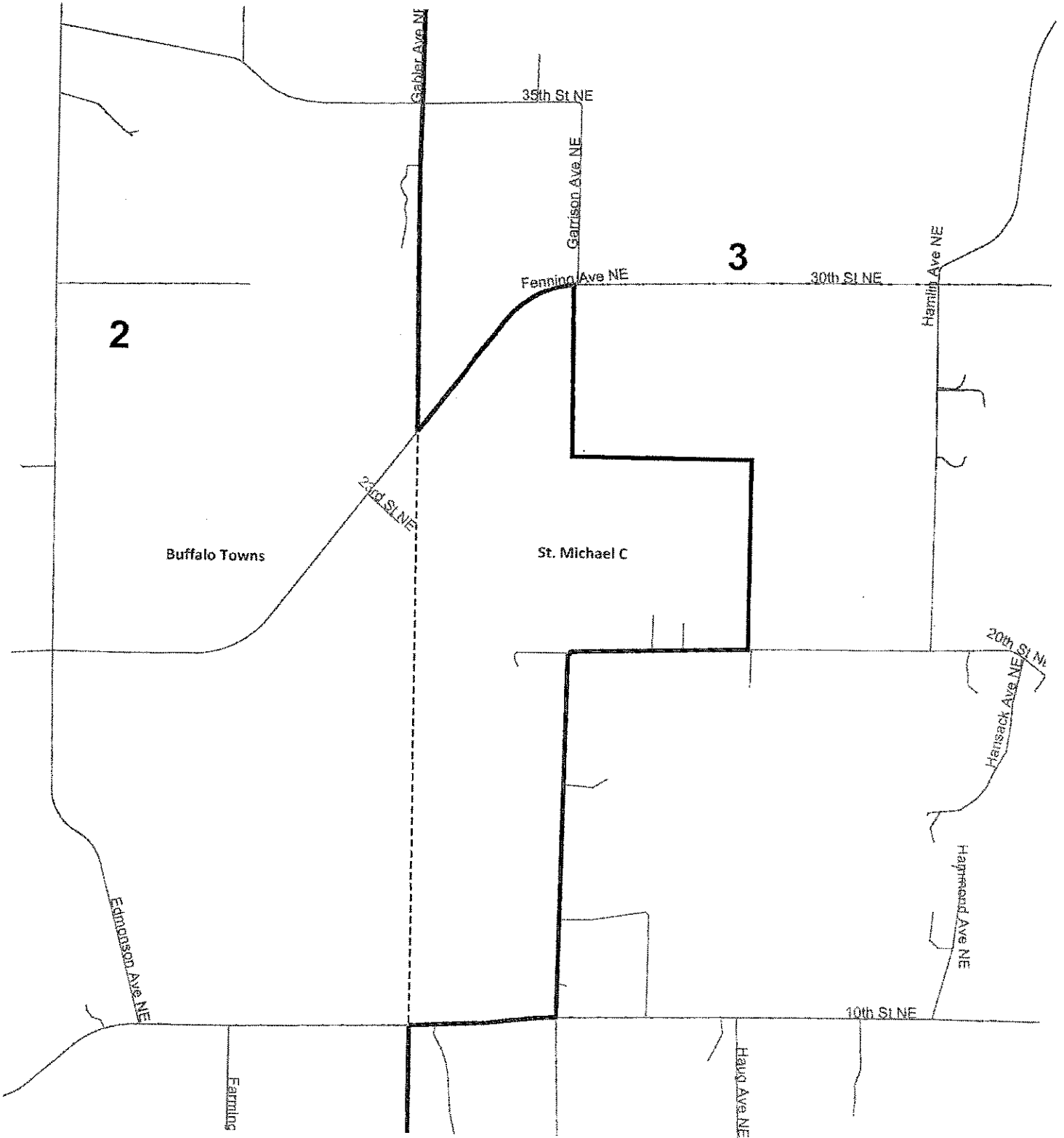


# Britton et al Congressional Plan City Split - Nowthen (Anoka)

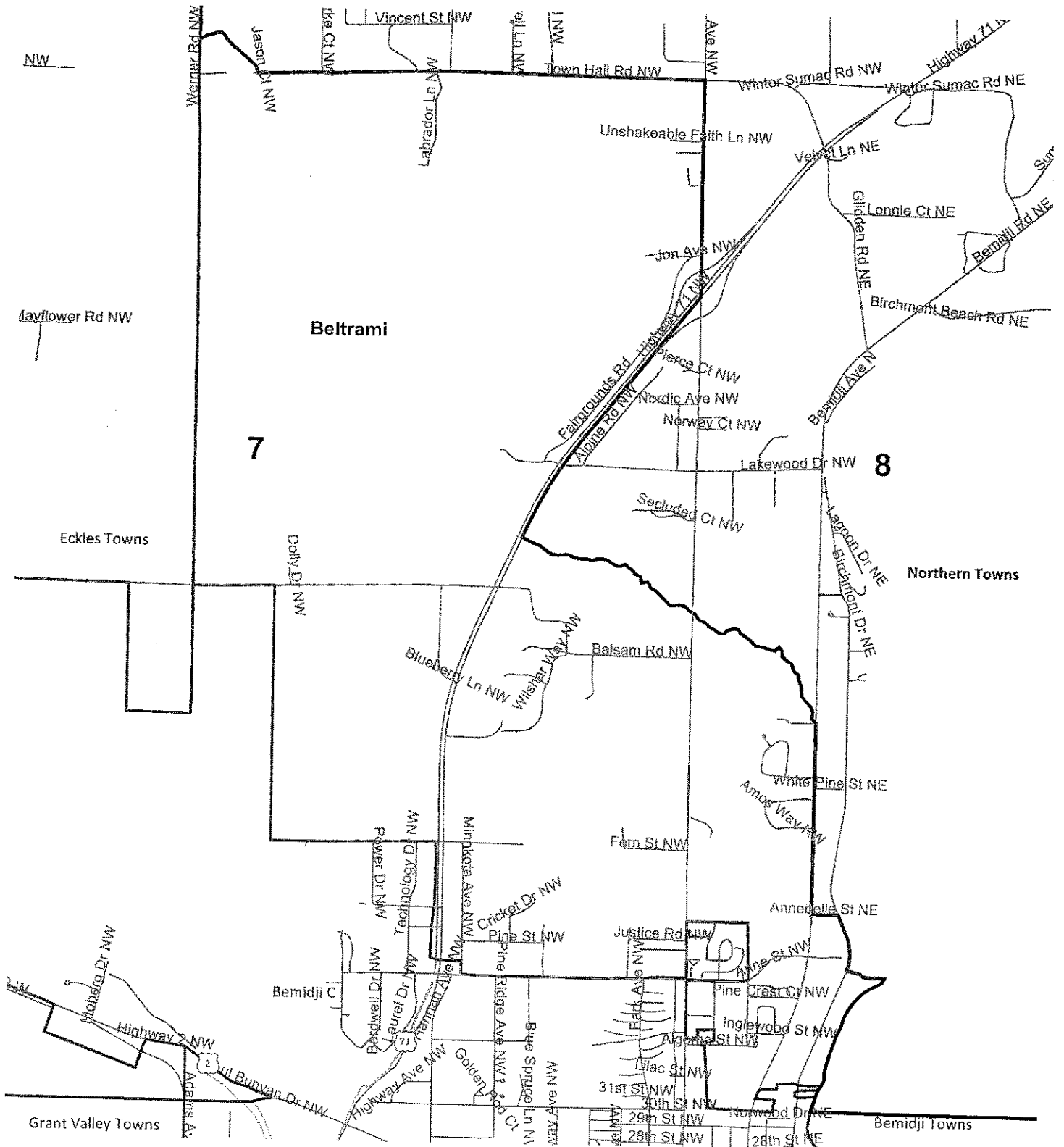




# Britton et al Congressional Plan City Split - St. Michael (Wright)
