**ORDER REGARDING PUBLIC HEARING ON PETITION TO AMEND  
THE RULES OF THE MINNESOTA STATE BOARD  
OF CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION**

On August 7, 2019, five Minnesota licensed attorneys filed a petition that asks this court to amend Rule 6D of the Rules of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education, which governs the credits that can be reported for on-demand continuing legal education (CLE) courses. We opened a 60-day public comment period on the request to amend Rule 6D to eliminate the current 15-hour credit limit for on-demand CLE courses, and scheduled a public hearing for January 29, 2020. Eight comments were filed, along with five requests to speak at the public hearing.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

1. The hearing to consider the petition to amend Rule 6D of the Rules of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education will be held in the Supreme Court Courtroom, State Capitol, Saint Paul, Minnesota, on January 29, 2020, at 10 a.m. Jaime N. Cavanaugh, representative of the petitioners, shall speak first at the hearing and shall have up to 15 minutes of time to present the remarks of the petitioners.

2. The Chair and the Director of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education shall speak next and shall together have 15 minutes of time to present the Board's remarks.

3. Representatives of the following organizations shall proceed next and shall each have up to 10 minutes of time to present the remarks of the organization:

Minnesota CLE

Minnesota State Bar Association
