1. Provide a concise statement of the case including facts and legal basis:

On February 12, 2018, the Ramsey County District Court dismissed, without prejudice, Plaintiff's Complaint that Lieutenant Governor Michelle Fischbach's stated intention to retain her seat in the Minnesota Senate after ascending to the office of lieutenant governor violated the Minnesota Constitution. The Court cautioned that it had grave concerns regarding whether the Constitution allowed Lieutenant Governor Fischbach to continue to hold the legislative office but reasoned that the action was premature given that the 2018 legislative session had not yet started; that the Senate has exclusive authority to determine the eligibility of its members; and that Destiny Dusosky had not suffered a particularized injury.

Circumstances have changed in the past eight weeks. The 2018 legislative session is well underway and Lieutenant Governor Fischbach is exercising the powers and duties of the office of state senator for Senate District 13. The Senate has failed to consider whether Lieutenant Governor Fischbach can continue to hold her legislative office. And Destiny Dusosky has been, and will continue to be, deprived of representation in the Minnesota Senate unless the Court intercedes and puts an end to Lieutenant Governor Fischbach's unconstitutional retention of the office of state senator. Plaintiff Destiny Dusosky brings this action, again, seeking an order declaring that Lieutenant Governor Fischbach is prohibited from holding the office of state senator and enjoining her from continuing to exercise the powers and duties of that office.
