

## Odyssey Integration Scenario 8 Court Decision Notifications

Notification Events: Court Decision Added, Court Decision Modified, Court Decision Amended, Court Decision Amendment Deleted, Court Decision Deleted

Sample Case: 87-CR-07-Scenario8 (Criminal Case Type)

Defendant Name: Clanry Ogavitz (This is a made-up name; any similarity to an existing person is purely coincidental.)

		Component Values. Does <u>not</u> include Sentence History References.
G	Court decision 1 deleted	Court Decision Deleted Notification Event includes two Sentence Disposition Detail elements with multiple Disposition Component Values. Does <u>not</u> include Sentence History References.
H	Court decision added with 3 components: 1 – fees 2 – probation 3 – diversion	Court Decision Added Notification Event includes three Sentence Disposition Detail elements with multiple Disposition Component Values.
I	Court decision modified (component 1 modified, component 4 added) 1 – fine modified to zero 2 – unchanged 3 – unchanged 4 – community work service added, in lieu of fine	Court Decision Modified Notification Event includes four Sentence Disposition Detail elements with multiple Disposition Component Values.
J (See Message H)	Court decision added	sentenceKey = <b>15723570</b>
K	Court decision amended	sentenceKey = <b>15723604</b>
L	Court decision amended again	sentenceKey = <b>15723607</b>

C	Court decision amended – Custody component: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Physical and legal custody awarded to one party</li> </ul>	Court Decision Amended Notification Event includes Amended Judgment elements.
D	Court decision amendment deleted	Currently not working. Defect #4517.
E	Court decision modified – comment added	Court Decision Modified Notification Event
F	Court decision deleted	Currently not working. Defect #4517.

### **Amending or modifying Court Decision**

In Odyssey, court decisions can either be amended or modified.

- The clerk amends the court decision record as a result of a hearing or order.
  - From an integration perspective, this results in one notification message coming out – that message contains one node showing the amended court decision record and a historical reference that points back to the previous version. See “Criminal Case Type Court Decision Amendment History” below.
- The clerk modifies the court decision record if an error was made during data entry.
  - From an integration perspective, this results in one notification message coming out – that message contains one node showing the modified court decision record.

### **Components of a Court Decision**

A court decision is a grouping of several components (e.g., confinement, diversion, restitution, etc.). Once entered, these components are amended, deleted, or modified as a set, not individually. For an example of this, see messages H and I. The overall notification event for Message I is “CourtDecisionModified,” where the first sentence component is modified, and a fourth sentence component is added.

### **Criminal Case Type Court Decision Amendment History**

When a court decision is amended several times, you can determine the history of amendments. This is shown in messages J, K, and L.

Each criminal case type court decision message has a sentenceEventKey that uniquely identifies that court decision. Each amended court decision also has a historical reference that points back to the previous version of this court decision.

In the criminal case type scenario above, when the first court decision is added (message J), the sentenceEventKey attribute is 1761331. When it is amended, the new amended court decision has a sentenceEventKey attribute of 1761333, as well as a

<SentenceEventHistoryReference> element with a sentenceEventKey attribute that points back to the previous sentence (1761331). The second amended court decision has a key of 1761335, and points back to the previous sentence (1761333).

### **Family Case Type Court Decision Amendment History**

Each family case type court decision message has a judgmentKey that uniquely identifies that court decision. Each amended court decision has a judgment reference that points back to the previous version of this court decision.

So, in summary, each amended court decision points back to the previous court decision version, before the latest amendment. Using these references you can "walk" back to the original court decision.
