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**MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING Deputy STANDING ORDER  
AT THE HENNEPIN COUNTY JUVENILE  
DETENTION CENTER AND JUVENILE  
PROBATION DIVISION**

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WHEREAS the Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation's Juvenile Services Area is committed to improving community safety and offender change through proven interventions.

WHEREAS improving the mental health of children being served by the Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation's Juvenile Services Area is critical to improving their behaviors and increasing community safety.

WHEREAS the Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation's Juvenile Services Area uses validated screening and assessment tools to determine the risks and needs of its clients, including their mental health needs, and targets interventions to high risk and high need domains.

WHEREAS the Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation's Juvenile Services Area is committed to complying with all applicable Minnesota mental health screening statutes, rules and requirements from the Department of Human Services (DHS) in an efficient and effective manner. These include, but are not limited to, the following:

Minnesota Statute 260B.176  
DHS Bulletin #09-53-05

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

1. That all youth admitted to the Hennepin County Juvenile Detention Center (JDC) will submit to a mental health screen within three days of admission. The staff administering this mental health screen will use the Massachusetts Youth Screening Instrument (MAYSI-2) and the results of this screen will be secured in the youth's medical file. The results of the MAYSI-2 screen performed at the JDC are considered to be medical data and will not be released unless so ordered by the Fourth Judicial District Court, Juvenile Court Division. The exception may be found where a juvenile is adjudicated delinquent and subsequently placed out of his or her home by order of the Fourth Judicial District Court, Juvenile Court Division. In those cases, the result of the MAYSI-2 screen performed at the JDC may be released to the placement agency for purposes of treatment planning while the child is in placement.

2. That the following youth must submit to a mental health screen (MAYSI-2) performed by a Probation Officer of the Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation's Juvenile Probation Division:

Youth ages 10 to 18 years who have:

- A judicial finding of delinquency, according to Minnesota Statute, section 260B.007, subdivision 6. Youth on probation age 18 to 21 on Extended Juvenile Jurisdiction are excluded.
- Committed a juvenile petty offense for the third or subsequent time.


In accordance with Minnesota Statute, section 245.4874, subdivision 1(14), youth meeting the above criteria who also meet any of the following conditions are exempt from the MAYSI-2 mental health screening:

- Screening has been performed within the previous 180 days
- Diagnostic assessment has been performed within the previous 180 days
- Youth is under the care of a mental health professional [mental health professional defined in Minnesota Statute, section 245.4871, subdivision 27]
- Youth is receiving Children's Mental Health Case Management
- Parent or legal guardian prevents the screening in writing to the court.
- Unable to locate youth
