The management of court records is controlled by the <u>Records Retention Schedule</u> for the MN Judicial Branch, and the law at <u>Minn. Stat. § 138.17</u> on keeping and destroying public records.

Housing Court files are generally open to the public. See the MN Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch. There is **no charge** to look at a file or court record.

How to Get Court Records

Online

Minnesota Court Records Online (MCRO) provides online access to many public Minnesota state district court records and documents. **Note:** There are limits to what can be viewed online that are described in the MN Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch. Online records **do not include** street addresses for parties, or document images.

At the Courthouse

People can search court records **and** view documents online using public-access computers located in the District Court Records Center on the skyway level in the <u>Hennepin County Government Center</u>. If you want to get a copy of a document from a court file, there are <u>fees</u> for plain and certified copies.
