

Sherburne ENE Provider Roster Criteria

- I. Minimum Criteria
 - a. SENE
 - i. Completed Initial SENE Provider Training as a trainee or an original trainer.
 - ii. Complete two SENE Ride-alongs, AFTER completing Initial SENE Provider Training.
 - iii. Be willing to travel, at least in the county of venue, to perform SENEs.
 - iv. Agree to be paired with all opposite-gendered members of the program's SENE roster.
 - b. FENE
 - i. Completed Initial FENE Provider Training as a trainee or an original trainer.
 - ii. Complete one FENE Ride-along, AFTER completing Initial FENE Provider Training, if also received SENE Training and attended two SENE Ride-alongs; otherwise, need two FENE Ride-alongs observing two different providers.
 - c. Both
 - i. Be a Rule 114 Qualified Evaluative Neutral (appear on State ADR Board Roster).
 - ii. Be in good standing with the ADR Board and the issuing authority for all professional licenses held.
 - iii. Minimum of five (5) years significant experience working with families in divorce- or custody- related work.
 - iv. Ability and agreement to make 2 sessions available per week generally in SharePoint ENE Calendar and report absences of greater than 30 days.
 - v. Acknowledge and agree to all Sherburne ENE policies and procedures and fee scales.
- II. Additional Criteria
 - a. Licensed attorney, CPA, or mental health/therapist license. (Preferred.)
 - b. Substantial experience and expertise in custody and dissolution matters, including sufficient knowledge and background, to make *a valid evaluative opinion as to what a court would do in a family law case.* (Substantiated.)
 - c. Good standing with ethics boards and lack of concerns regarding disciplinary issues.
 - d. Suitability and aptitude for guiding resolution of cases within the context of ENE.
 - e. Any other areas bearing on one's ability and suitability to appear on a court-sponsored roster and be given quasi-judicial immunity in an order for ENE.
