**ORDER ESTABLISHING TEMPORARY EXCEPTION TO  
RULE 6(D) OF THE RULES OF THE MINNESOTA STATE  
BOARD OF CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION**

The Rules of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education limit Minnesota lawyers to “15 hours of credit within the 45 hour CLE period for on-demand courses.” Minn. R. Continuing Legal Educ. 6(D).

The Governor of the State of Minnesota declared a peacetime emergency on March 13, 2020, Minn. Stat. § 12.31, subd. 2(a) (2018), and additional restrictions on public activities have been imposed. Based on these extraordinary events, and in light of the court’s inherent authority to regulate the practice of law in Minnesota,

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

The 15-credit limit for on-demand continuing legal education courses in Rule 6(D) of the Rules of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education is suspended, effectively immediately, for lawyers in category 3 due to report August 31, 2020 for the reporting period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2020. This suspension remains in effect until further order of the court.
