Criminal History Check Release

Minnesota Statute requires that the Court shall determine whether any person who asks to have their name changed has a criminal history in this or any other state. The court may conduct a search of national records through the Federal Bureau of Investigation by submitting a set of fingerprints and the required fee to the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension.

To comply with Minn. Stat. § 259.11, you must supply the following information and file this document with the *Petition for Adult Adoption*. You must complete a separate form for each adult adoptee listed on the petition.

If there is a criminal history, both the court administrator and the adult adoptee must report the name change to the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension within ten days of the date of filing. (See instructions for additional information.)
