
On February 28, 2019, the Court and the parties held a trial management conference during which administrative and scheduling issues in the above-referenced case were discussed. Based on the issues presented at that conference and at the pretrial hearing on March 1, 2019, the Court issues the following

AMENDED SCHEDULING ORDER

1. The deadline for disclosing expert names and reports is January 11, 2019.
2. Notice of any general defense must be provided by January 11, 2019. The Court will allow for additional defenses to be raised after this date through a proper showing.
3. The filing deadline for pretrial motions is February 15, 2019. Responses are to be filed by February 25, 2019.
4. A hearing was scheduled for March 1, 2019, to address any pretrial motions raised before the filing deadline.
5. The deadline for the State to provide an offer of proof with respect to its fly-through exhibit is March 15, 2019. The deadline for Noor's response is March 20, 2019.
6. The deadline for Noor to provide Emanuel Kapelsohn's CV and reports as court exhibits is March 15, 2019.
7. The deadline for filing additional motions *in limine* to be addressed by the Court prior to jury selection in this case is March 15, 2019. Responses are to be filed by March 20, 2019.
8. The Court indicated at the March 1, 2019, pretrial hearing that either party may examine opposing experts on their qualifications. The State requested a hearing to examine Noor's expert Emanuel Kapelsohn. On March 8, 2019, Noor filed a motion to examine the State's experts Derrick Hacker and Timothy Longo. The hearing on expert qualifications will be held on March 29, 2019. Experts Kapelsohn, Hacker, and Longo should be made available for that hearing.

9. The March 29, 2019, hearing will also address any objections to the submission of materials as court exhibits under Minnesota Rule of Criminal Procedure 25, as well as the Court's proposal to anonymize the jury panel. If the parties wish to file written submissions on these issues, they should do so by March 20, 2019.
10. This case is scheduled for a Jury Trial on April 1, 2019.
