# Why use the MNPAT-R?

- The MNPAT-R identifies the level of risk defendants pose of not appearing for a hearing or committing a crime during the pretrial period
- Statistically validated and shown to be more predictive than the MNPAT
- Equitable predictor among races and genders
- Provides consistent information for all stakeholders in their respective decision-making
- Also consistent across the state/jurisdictions (82 counties)


### Key Characteristics of the MNPAT-R

- The statewide form/tool cannot be changed or adapted by locality.
- Some factors assessed through a defendant interview
- If any factors are blank, that field was unable to be scored by probation/designee
- Probation does not recommend a release decision
  - May offer pretrial conditions if the judge orders conditional release

#### Not the Whole Picture

The MNPAT-R is **one** objective piece of information to be used in addition to a judge's experience and discretion to help determine risk.

#### **Definitions**

**Form**: Template for recording factors of a particular defendant and the current charge used to inform the pretrial release decision.

Does not assign a score or recommendation of release

**Tool**: Research-based instrument comprised of predictive factors that are weighted and scored to provide a recommended pretrial release decision (based on categorized risk of pretrial failure).

- Included on the form
- Provides a numeric score and category of risk



#### **Consistent Interview Process**

- Enhancing procedural justice
  - Goal of training is to drive consistency during the implementation process
  - Each county may be collecting additional information in the interview for other purposes
  - How the interview/questionnaire is started will impact data quality
- Site visits from 2016 revealed varying practices in interviews
  - Some interviews were approached as conversations. Others were a checklist of questions to be answered. Some interviewers sought to get as much detail as possible for multiple purposes, others simply asked questions needed for the tool/form.


### Beginning the Interview or Questionnaire



#### Communicate the following:

- Your name and the organization you work for
- You're not their attorney
- Information provided will be given to the court to help determine pretrial conditions/release
- The information obtained cannot be used against the defendant at trial
- The defendant's attorney will be provided a copy
- Next steps in the process

### How should the form be used?

#### Information from the form should:

- Help inform questions from the bench during the bail hearing
- Help inform the pretrial release decision, in addition to the pretrial risk score

## **Current monitoring**

#### **Pretrial Conditional Release**

Yes -4 pts

Defendant was released from custody on pretrial conditions pending the disposition of a criminal case. Defendant may or may not have a pretrial officer assigned, if there are conditions of release it gets counted.

Do not score if the defendant is released or posted bail/bond without conditions.

#### **Probation**

Yes -4 pts

Defendant is compliant while being supervised for conditions of probation (excluding the current alleged criminal behavior).

Do not score if the defendant is on probation to the court.



## **Current monitoring**

#### **Revoked Probation**

Yes -4 pts

Defendant is alleged to be not compliant with conditions of probation and is currently in violation status (e.g., warrant, in-custody pending court, etc.).

Do not score if the defendant is on probation to the court.

#### **Supervised Release**

Yes -4 pts

Defendant is under supervision after serving a prison sentence.

#### Victim Information

- When possible, victim information should be summarized in the Comments from Collateral/Victim Sources section
- Any discrepancies between the defendant's stated information and the victim's statement must be noted on the form

#### **Criminal Conviction Detail**

- Criminal conviction history: List the offense, conviction date, and state or county for qualifying criminal convictions.
- Ensure only details on convictions are provided to the court
  - Include date, type, county
- CISR report may be provided, but may only include convictions
- The full CISR report (i.e. information in addition to convictions) should not be provided to judges, as the additional information may introduce bias based on non-convicted charges.

#### **Criminal Conviction Detail**

- Criminal conviction history does not have time parameters. All qualifying adult criminal cases should be included in the list.
- Include and list EJJ juvenile adjudications. If the EJJ is cleared, it should not be included in the list.
- Do not include non-EJJ juvenile adjudications Criminal Conviction History.
- Do not include cases that have received a Stay of Adjudication (SOA), regardless of offense level.

#### **Out of State Convictions**

If a defendant has convictions from outside Minnesota and that state's offense classifications are different, classify the offenses by the sentence.

- 90 days or less as a misdemeanor,
- 364 days or less as a gross misdemeanor, and
- 1 year or more as a felony.
- If specific sentence information is unavailable, assign and list the conviction as a misdemeanor.

# Failure to Appear Bench Warrants

- Include bench warrants for failure to appear three years prior from the date of screening. For example, if the defendant was screened on 2/1/2024, warrants from 2/1/2021 – 2/1/2024 would be included on the list.
- Include failure to appear bench warrants originating from family court.
- Do not include Fail to Appear bench warrants that have a comment stating failure to abide by conditions of release.
- Do not include Failure to Appear bench warrants that are issued as a result of a missed initial hearing from a summons.
- Do not include failure to appear warrants if the defendant failed to appear as a result of being held in custody in another jurisdiction (including ICE custody). This is often noted in the warrant comments or denoted by a Hold and Release Warrant type.
- If the client was to appear in court on the same day for multiple cases and failed to appear, only one bench warrant should be included.

#### Enter within 5 days

Enter the collected MNPAT-R data into the CSTS module as soon as practicable, but **no** later than 5 business days following the first appearance.

#### Refused/unknown fields


If client refuses to answer a scored field on the **Pretrial Assessment Tool** section (grey portion), the agent should select "Unknown" in the CSTS module. This will populate "Could not score" in the field on the form. The remainder of the form should still be completed, scored (including the total score), and provided to the bench and stakeholders with the available information.

#### Collateral/Victim Sources

Ask the client who can be called to verify the information. Potential contacts include, but are not limited to parents, siblings, significant others, adult children, family members, and friends. Contacts should be over 18 years of age.


