

Ignition Interlock Program Checklist (Use this checklist if your license has been revoked)

Am I eligible to apply for the Ignition Interlock Program?	
	Age 18 and eligible for Class D license (no other license classes are eligible to install ignition interlock)
	Own or able to drive a vehicle – not a moped or motorcycle
	My vehicle is insured
	I am not subject to Vanessa's Law because of a DWI before age 18
	I have no other withdrawals on my license (ex. lost license due to failure to pay child support)
I have gone to my local DVS office to do the following:	
	Go to <u>www.mndrive.info</u> to find a local DVS office
	Purchased new plates (if your plates were impounded)
	Passed the DWI knowledge test
	Paid the \$680 reinstatement fee – the <u>Partial Payment Program</u> may assist with the cost
	Completed application for a new Class D license and kept my receipt
Once you've completed all of the above you are ready to apply to install ignition interlock.	
Send the following forms to the Ignition Interlock Unit (fax paperwork to #651-797-1299):	
	Signed and dated <u>Ignition Interlock Participation Agreement</u>
	Signed and notarized <u>Special Review Awareness form</u> if you have more than one DWI on your record
	Submit an SR-22 from Insurance company for the vehicle to be equipped with the device. The VIN (Vehicle
	Identification Number) of the vehicle with the device must match the VIN on the Certificate of Insurance.
And send the following forms to the Fifth Judicial District's Ignition Interlock Coordinator:	
	Signed and dated Application and Release form for Ignition Interlock
When you get a letter from Driver & Vehicle Services that your ignition interlock application has been approved:	
	Contact the 5 th Judicial District Ignition Interlock Program Coordinator to make payment arrangements (Jackie Murray: 507-338-2181/Jacqueline.Murray@courts.state.mn.us)
	Schedule ignition interlock installation with Intoxalock (888) 283-5499 – tell them you are in the "5 th Judicial
	District Ignition Interlock Program"
DO NOT DRIVE YET!	
Do not drive until you hear from Driver and Vehicle Services or from the Ignition Interlock Coordinator that you	
are legally cleared to drive.
