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I. Access and Fairness Committee Charge on Jury Race Study.

During the FY20-21 biennium, the Access and Fairness Subcommittee (“Subcommittee”) of the Committee for Equality and Justice (“CEJ”) was charged to review available data provided by State Court Administration that identifies the race of those who are called for jury service, selected for jury panels, and seated on the juries. The Subcommittee was also charged with making recommendations for improvement in court processes, procedures, and policies based on its findings.

II. Background Information on Minnesota District Court Juries and Selection

The Sixth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution provides that “[i]n all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed . . . .” A jury must be “drawn from a fair cross section of the community.” *Taylor v. Louisiana*, 419 U.S. 526, 527 (1975). This provision “is made binding on the States by virtue of the Fourteenth Amendment.” *Id.* at 526. Article I, section 6 of the Minnesota Constitution mirrors the Sixth Amendment. Furthermore, the Equal Protection guarantee of the Fifth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution “requires that the procedures used to select jury pools be racially nondiscriminatory.”

By way of background, Minnesota has two types of juries: petit juries and grand juries. In order to better understand the ultimate racial composition of our juries, it is necessary to first briefly explain each type of jury, the manner in which jurors are initially called for jury service and how jurors are ultimately seated on the jury panel.

A. Petit Jury

A petit jury is a body of six persons (or a body of 12 persons in criminal felony proceedings) impaneled and sworn in any court to try and determine, by verdict, any question or issue of fact in a civil or criminal action or proceeding. Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 802(i). Persons are selected randomly for jury service. Minn. Stat. § 593.31; Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 801; Minn. R. Crim. P. 26.02.

A jury commissioner is established in each county to administer the jury system under the supervision and control of the chief judge of the judicial district. Each jury commissioner must place into operation a written plan for the administration of the jury system.

The Minnesota statewide jury source list is created from two major state databases, as required by Minn. R. Gen. Prac. 806(b): (1) the Department of Public Safety’s database of licensed drivers and Minnesota State ID Card holders; and (2) the Secretary of State’s database of registered voters. *See also* Minn. Stat. § 593.37. Deceased persons’ names from a list provided by the Department of Health are matched against the merged driver’s and voter’s list and are removed from the jury source list. Attached at Appendix 1 is an illustration demonstrating the source of potential juror names and how lists are processed to produce jury panels in the Minnesota State Court system.

Annually, the State Court Administrator's Office compiles the statewide jury source list. The jury commissioner for each county is responsible for obtaining copies of the jury source list.<sup>1</sup> The source list may be supplemented with names from other lists specified in the jury administration plan. Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 806(b). If the chief judge, or designee, determines that improvement is needed in either the inclusiveness of the jury source list or the representativeness of the jury pool, appropriate corrective action shall be ordered. Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 806(f).

A jury questionnaire and summons for service is mailed to every prospective juror drawn along with instructions to complete and return such questionnaire either in paper or online within ten days of receipt. Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 807. A copy of the jury questionnaire and summons is attached at Appendix 2.

Minnesota law prohibits discrimination of jurors on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, sex, national origin, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, disability, age, occupation, physical or sensory disability, sexual orientation, or economic status. Minn. Stat. § 593.32; Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 809.

To be qualified to serve as a juror, the prospective juror must be: (1) a citizen of the United States; (2) at least 18 years old; (3) a resident of the county; (4) able to communicate in the English language; (5) physically and mentally capable of rendering satisfactory jury service;<sup>2</sup> (6) a person who has had their civil rights restored if they have been convicted of a felony; and (7) a person who has not served as a state or federal grand or petit juror in the past four years. Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 808.

Jurors may be excused or deferred from service. A juror may be excused from service only if: (1) their ability to receive and evaluate information is too impaired that they are unable to perform their duties as jurors and they are excused for this reason by a jury commissioner or a judge; or (2) they request to be excused because their service would be a continuing hardship to them or to members of the public and they are excused for this reason by the jury commissioner. Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 810. Jury service may also be deferred if the juror meets conditions for deferral set out in the jury administration plan. The deferral shall be for a reasonable amount of time, after which the juror shall be available for service. *Id.*

After jurors have been drawn and assigned to a jury panel for voir dire, a party may challenge the jury panel. Jurors may also be stricken for cause or as a result of a preemptory challenge. Any party may challenge the jury panel if a material departure from law has occurred in drawing or summoning jurors. In both civil and criminal cases, jurors may be stricken for cause as outlined in the rules. In addition, in civil cases, each adverse party is entitled to two preemptory challenges. Minn. Stat. § 546.10. In criminal

cases, the defendant has five peremptory challenges and the prosecutor has three.<sup>3</sup> Minn. R. Crim. P. 26.02, subd. 6.

#### B. Grand Jury

In Minnesota, grand juries perform the following functions:

1. *Bring charges.* Indictments must be used by a prosecutor if the offense charged is punishable by life imprisonment (Minn. Stat. §§ 609.185; 609.385), and may, at the option of the prosecutor, be used in other cases. Minn. R. Crim. P. 17.01.
2. *Inquiries regarding prisons and public officials.* Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 628.61, the grand jury shall inquire into:
  - a. The condition of every person imprisoned on a criminal charge in the county, and not indicted;
  - b. The condition and management of the public prisons in the county; and
  - c. The willful and corrupt misconduct of all public officials holding office in the county.

A grand jury must consist of not more than 23, nor fewer than 16 persons, and must not proceed unless at least 16 members are present. Minn. Stat. § 628.41, subd. 1; Minn. R. Crim. P. 18.02, subd. 1.

One or more grand juries must be drawn at least annually. The grand jury must be summoned and convened whenever required by the public interest, or whenever requested by the County Attorney. On being drawn for grand jury service, each juror must be notified of the selection. Minn. R. Crim. P. 18.01, subd. 1.

The grand jury pool must be drawn from a list composed of the names of persons selected at random from a fair cross section of the statutorily qualified residents of the county.<sup>4</sup> Minn. R. Crim. P. 18.01, subd. 2.

Minnesota grand jurors are drawn from the same pool of potential jurors as are the other jury panels for petit jury trials, and in the same manner. The pool consists of names gathered from the Minnesota voter's registration list and driver's license list which includes names of state identification card holders.

Pursuant to Minn. R. Crim. P. 18.08, subd. 1, a pool of grand jurors must be drawn for a specified period of time, not to exceed 12 months, as designated by court order. A grand jury panel must not be discharged, and its powers must continue until the latest of the following: (1) the period of service is completed; (2) its successor is drawn; or (3) it has completed an investigation, already begun, of a particular offense.

Prospective grand jurors, like petit jurors, may be disqualified or excused from jury service by a jury commissioner pursuant to the limitations set forth in Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 808. Like petit jurors, eligible persons who are summoned may be excused by the jury commissioner from jury service. See Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 810. The Court may excuse a juror, temporarily or permanently, for cause shown; the court may impanel another person in place of the excused juror. Minn. R. Crim. P. 18.08, subd. 2. An objection to an individual grand juror may be based on the cause that the grand juror: (1) is less than 18 years of age; (2) is not a citizen of the United States; (3) has not resided in this state for 30 days; (4) lacks mental capacity; (5) is a prosecutor upon a charge against the defendant; (6) is a witness on the part of the prosecution, and has been served with process or bound by recognizance as such; or (7) is of a state of mind in reference to the case or to either party which shall satisfy the court, in the exercise of a sound discretion, that the juror cannot act impartially and without prejudice to the substantial rights of the party objecting. Minn. Stat. § 628.54. If an objection to an individual grand juror is made, the prosecutor may ask for a hearing before the judge to determine if the juror should be excused. See Minn. Stat. § 628.54 (grounds for objection to grand juror).

### *III. Jury Race Data and Census Population Data Studied*

The Subcommittee studied petit jury race data and grand jury race data and compared such information against the 2018 Census Bureau Population Estimates of the adult population.

The Subcommittee studied petit jury race data for jurors who report for jury duty, jurors selected for voir dire, and jurors seated on a jury. The Subcommittee requested this data be broken out by judicial district and county. Because jury trials occur infrequently in some counties, the Subcommittee requested data from the previous two calendar years (2018 and 2019) be pooled together to provide as much county-level information as possible.

The Subcommittee studied data on the racial composition of individual petit juries in this time period (2018 and 2019), namely the percentage of juries which consist of only white, non-Hispanic jurors. This data is broken out by district and county.

The Subcommittee studied statewide data on petit juror disqualifications and excusals by race among all individuals summoned for jury duty in this time period (2018 and 2019). This dataset includes a breakout by reason for the disqualification or excusal. The dataset only includes the first reason listed, even though multiple reasons may have been recorded. Disqualification reasons are recorded in the jury management system in the priority order listed on the juror questionnaire.

The Subcommittee studied grand jury race data, which is available for grand jurors who report for jury duty. This data is broken out by district.

The Subcommittee requested the most current population data from the Census Bureau as a comparison for the jury data. The Census Bureau's American Community Survey was considered, but age and race demographics from that survey are not available for all 87 counties in Minnesota. The Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program provides yearly updates to all 87 county populations disaggregated by age

and race. Ultimately, the Subcommittee decided to use the 2018 Census Bureau Population Estimates, the most recent available data at the time.

Ideally, population data for all adults age 18 and older would be used, but population estimates are only available in five-year age groups, including one group for those age 15 to 19. The Subcommittee studied a sensitivity analysis on the impact of including the 15 to 19 age group, found little impact, and ultimately decided to exclude that age group from the comparison. The population data used is for all adults age 20 and older.

#### IV. Research Findings

Attached at Appendix 3 are the datasets studied by the Subcommittee, described above.

##### a. Key Definitions

Various terms exist for describing each stage of the jury selection process. Terms used in this report are defined here. **Summoned jurors** include all individuals issued a summons for jury service. Not all summoned jurors receive the summons or respond. Based on their responses to a questionnaire included in the summons, jurors are either found qualified or not qualified. Summoned jurors may also request to be excused or deferred. **Pool jurors** include all individuals who report for jury service. **Sworn jurors** include all individuals who are seated and sworn on a jury.

##### b. Race Statistics of the Jury Pool and of Sworn Jurors

The data shows that white, non-Hispanic Minnesotans are represented at a higher rate in the 2018-2019 jury pool, and most other racial groups are underrepresented, when compared to 2018 Census Population Estimates of the adult population age 20 and older.

- White, non-Hispanic Minnesotans make up 83% of the adult population, 89% of the jury pool, and 88% of sworn jurors.
- Black/ African American Minnesotans make up 5.5% of the adult population, 3.3% of the jury pool, and 3.7% of sworn jurors. This is a comparative disparity in the jury pool of 41% compared to the population.
- Hispanic Minnesotans make up 4.3% of the adult population, 2.4% of the jury pool, and 2.5% of sworn jurors. This is a comparative disparity in the jury pool of 44% compared to the population.
- Similar patterns are found in the smaller 2018-2019 grand jury pool, where white, non-Hispanic Minnesotans make up 89% of those reporting for grand jury service, compared to 83% of the population.

In a further analysis, the Subcommittee found that 45% of the juries seated statewide in 2018-2019 consisted of only white, non-Hispanic jurors. This percentage varies widely across the state. The racial composition of seated juries (rather than the jury pool) can contribute to public perceptions of racial representation and fairness. "To the extent that the perception of justice legitimizes our justice system, maximizing that perception is in the justice system's best interest and having people of color represented on grand juries is essential toward that end." *Hennepin County v. Perry*, 561 N.W.2d 889, 898 (1997).

In order to understand whether and to what extent disqualification from jury service (e.g., felony conviction, non-citizen, non-English speaker) are contributing to Black/ African American and Hispanic underrepresentation in the jury pool, jury pool race data would need to be compared to the population who is qualified for jury duty rather than the general population. As noted in prior research on fair cross section analyses, however, data on the jury-eligible population are not readily available.<sup>5</sup>

The Minnesota Judicial Branch does collect race data on disqualified jurors. However, a large share of disqualified jurors choose not to provide their race. Nearly one-third (28%) of disqualified jurors do not provide their race, compared to just 2% of pool jurors. The reason for this relatively high rate of non-response to the request for race data is not known. Although all prospective jurors are encouraged to fill out all questions on the jury questionnaire, the demographic questions, including questions on race and ethnicity, are optional.

The available data, representing the 72% of disqualified jurors who provided their race, does suggest that Black/ African American and Hispanic Minnesotans are disqualified at a higher rate than white, non-Hispanic Minnesotans.

- According to available data, 1 in 5 summoned Black/ African American and Hispanic Minnesotans are disqualified, compared to 1 in 13 summoned white, non-Hispanic Minnesotans.

Other research shows that certain disqualifying reasons, such as citizenship<sup>6</sup> and felony convictions<sup>7</sup>, have clear disparate impacts by race.

Ultimately, the available data does not conclusively indicate the root cause(s) of the observed disparity in the jury pool when compared to the adult population age 20 and older. Black/ African American and Hispanic Minnesotans may be overrepresented among disqualified jurors, overrepresented among those who do not receive or do not respond to the summons, underrepresented in the jury source list, or all of the above.

Finally, the Subcommittee studied data on race statistics through the juror selection process (voir dire). This data shows that voir dire introduces only small disparities and has a positive impact for some communities of color.

- Asian/ Pacific Islander and Black/ African American jurors are more likely to be chosen as a sworn juror through the voir dire process compared to their share among jurors selected for voir dire (23% and 21% more likely, respectively).

This suggests that the underrepresentation of certain communities of color on seated juries generally stems from underrepresentation among those who report for jury duty, not from disproportionate impacts during voir dire.

*c. Inclusivity Rates*

The National Center for State Courts recommends that the jury source list encompass 85% of the total adult population;<sup>8</sup> a benchmark that Minnesota exceeds on a statewide basis. Based on this study, Minnesota's 2018 jury source list encompasses 94% of the 2018 Census Population Estimates and 95% in 2019. While each judicial district exceeds the National Center for State Court's recommendations for the time period studied, individual counties in out-state Minnesota fall below the threshold.

*d. Comparison to FY20 Annual Performance Measures Report*

In the course of the Subcommittee's work, we learned that in September 2020, Judicial Council received the FY20 Performance Measure Annual Report which also provides data on the racial composition of the jury pools. The data provided in the FY20 Performance Measure Annual Report differ in important ways from the data provided here, most importantly in the comparison population data used in this report. As outlined below, the differences in results stem from the following: (1) comparison population data utilized in each study, (2) presentation of race and ethnicity, and (3) presentation of missing race data.

- The comparison population data differ.
  - The FY20 Performance Measures Annual Report compares the racial demographics of jurors who reported for service July 2019 – June 2020 with racial demographics of the adult population age 18 and over from the **2010 Decennial Census**.
  - The data provided to the Subcommittee compares the racial demographics of jurors who reported for service January 2018 – December 2019 with racial demographics of the adult population age 20 and over from the **2018 Census Population Estimates**.<sup>9</sup>
  - See Table 1 for a comparison of 2010 and 2018 Census data under the methodology used by the Subcommittee, illustrating the demographic changes in this period.
- The presentation of race and ethnicity differs.
  - The FY20 Performance Measures Annual Report reports on **race and ethnicity separately**.
  - The data provided to the Subcommittee **combines race and ethnicity** into a single demographic, so that individuals recorded as Hispanic may be of any race and individuals in all other racial groups are non-Hispanic.
- The presentation of missing race data differs.

- The FY20 Performance Measures Annual Report **includes** 1.2% of jurors who do not provide their race and 4% of jurors who do not provide their ethnicity in separate reporting categories.
- To calculate each racial group’s share of the total population, the data provided to the Subcommittee **excludes** 1.6% of jurors who do not provide their race/ethnicity from the share by race.

V. Recommendations and Conclusions

It is the Subcommittee’s recommendation that State Court Administration address the research findings contained within this report and implement the following key recommendations and observations.

- First, underlying this report are observations on limitations of data including race data provided by summoned jurors and limitations on lack of information on whether certain racial groups may be underrepresented in the jury source list, overrepresented among those who do not receive or do not respond to the summons, overrepresented among disqualified jurors, or all of the above.
  - To be clear, the Minnesota Judicial Branch cannot compel jurors to provide race data. Failure to disclose race data ultimately impacts the Minnesota Judicial Branch’s ability to evaluate the representativeness of juries. For example, while this study reflects that white, non-Hispanics are represented at a higher rate in the 2018-2019 jury pool, this study also reflects that 18% of summoned jurors did not provide race data and 28% of disqualified jurors did not provide race data.
  - While the Minnesota Judicial Branch cannot compel disclosure of race data, it can study whether additional steps can be taken to obtain race data where it may have otherwise not been disclosed or may have been refused. Similar steps have been implemented for race data collection for litigants in criminal, juvenile and child protection proceedings. In

addition, Minnesota Judicial Branch Performance Measures have been implemented to ensure that each judicial district prioritizes collection of race data for litigants in these substantive areas.

- While this study reflects certain comparative disparities in the jury pool compared to the population, the percentage of disqualified jurors that did not provide race data impacts our ability to account for likely disproportionate impacts stemming from juror disqualification. For example, it is mathematically possible that the percent of Black/African American and Hispanic pool jurors are representative of the qualified population, if these jurors are overrepresented in the 28% of disqualified jurors who did not provide their race. Ultimately, the available data does not allow the Subcommittee to make conclusions around the representativeness of the pool of jurors to the qualified population.
- Finally, the Subcommittee was advised that neither the Department of Public Safety nor the Secretary of State maintain race data. Consequently, the two databases underlying Minnesota's source list are devoid of initial reference to race or ethnic background. While the collection of race data and the authority to provide such information by either the Department of Public Safety or the Secretary of State is clearly outside the purview of Minnesota Judicial Branch action, targeted community outreach with intergovernmental agencies can address the importance and need for collection of race data which may lead to reforms in policy, procedure and/or legislative amendment to ensure that the source list mirrors census population estimates.
- Second, the Subcommittee spent considerable time researching and studying the source list to determine if there are ways to improve minority representation in the jury selection process. The Subcommittee has determined that the National Center for State Courts ("NCSC") is currently working with court leaders in various states on how to better develop and maintain inclusive, representative and accurate jury source lists. The project involves determining how courts compile their jury lists and how accurately those lists mirror the demographics of their communities, and then making recommendations to improve the source list. The NCSC has announced that it will release a best practice guide for the benefit of all states at the conclusion of its study. State Court Administration is in the best position to monitor this study and recommend improvements based on the NCSC findings and recommended best practices.
- Third, State Court Administration should examine issues facing inclusivity rates. To that end, State Court Administration should consider and recommend amendments to the General Rules of Practice that would ensure that a fair cross section of Minnesotans are serving on juries across the state. For example, Rule 806(e) should be amended to require the jury commissioner to review the source list every year (rather than every four years) for its inclusiveness and report the results to the chief judge of the district. State Court Administration should confirm that this process is completed every year. In addition, Rule 806(f) should be amended to include a standard

by which the chief judge of the district or designee may determine that the inclusiveness of the jury source list and/or representativeness of the jury pool is lacking. District Chief Judges or designees should be given regular training on how to determine whether corrective action is needed and what kind of corrective action might be available or appropriate.

- Fourth, State Court Administration should further study the effect of potential jurors who do not report for service on the representativeness of the jury pool and make recommendations to improve the system.

In addition to the foregoing, the rapidly changing demographics of the state support the use of more current recent census population estimates by State Court Administration when providing its Annual Performance Measures Report to Judicial Council. While there are arguments supporting the benefits of using the decennial census data, this study observes the impact of the rapidly changing demographics on research findings especially when the study is conducted closer to the next decennial update.


In addition to the above recommendations, the Subcommittee determined that targeted community outreach should be implemented immediately. The Equal Justice Committees of each district are particularly well-suited to undertake this outreach work, and this Subcommittee of the CEJ will create materials for the districts to use. Targeted community outreach should address issues including, but not limited to: 1) the importance of providing race data and why the Judicial Branch needs race information; 2) information on how to get on the source list; and 3) information on how to ensure that current address is accurate and importance of doing so.

In many ways the Minnesota Judicial Branch meets and exceeds many national standards to ensure prospective jurors properly represent the characteristics of the community at large. However, the Minnesota Judicial branch cannot become complacent where this study reflects certain comparative disparities and reflects that individual counties in out-state Minnesota fall below the required thresholds for inclusivity rates.

The Subcommittee recommends that during the FY22-23 biennium, State Court Administration report to the Subcommittee regarding the recommendations contained in this report as well as other recommendations for improvement to the jury system. In addition, the Subcommittee will prepare community outreach materials and work with local Equal Justice Committees to engage in targeted community outreach to improve jury participation.

### Notes on race statistics at each stage of the jury selection process

Population data is from the U.S. Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program, Annual County Resident Population Estimates by Age, Sex, Race, and Hispanic Origin: July 1, 2018.

Jurors self-identify their race and ethnicity on the juror questionnaire, sent to all summoned jurors.

In the 2018-2019 period, 1.6% of pool jurors did not provide their race or ethnicity and are not included in these results.

Summoned jurors are drawn at random from the juror source list. Everyone registered to vote in Minnesota, all holders of a Minnesota driver's license, and all holders of a Minnesota state ID card are included in the source list.

Summoned jurors are disqualified or excused from service for a limited number of reasons (e.g. felony conviction/civil rights not restored, not a citizen of the United States). See Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 808.

Jurors who report for service may be selected for more than one voir dire panel and may be sworn on more than one jury; in these results, jurors are counted once per voir dire panel they are involved in, and once per jury they are sworn in on.

Not every voir dire process results in a sworn jury; cases may resolve at any point in the process.

Civil and criminal trial juries are included in these results. Grand juries are excluded from these results.

To protect juror confidentiality, juror race is suppressed where the results could identify the race of individual jurors. Suppression is used when there are fewer than 10 jurors or when all jurors are of the same race. Suppression is indicated with an asterisk (\*).

Jurors self-identify their race and ethnicity on the juror questionnaire, sent to all summoned jurors.

In the 2018-2019 period, 1.6% of pool jurors did not provide their race or ethnicity and are not included in these results. 13% of juries have at least one juror who did not provide their race or ethnicity; those juries are not included in these results.

Trial juries on civil and criminal cases are included in these results; each jury typically has either six or 12 sworn jurors.

Grand juries are excluded from these results.

To protect juror confidentiality, results are suppressed in counties with fewer than 10 juries in this timeframe or where all juries include only white, non-Hispanic jurors. Suppression is indicated in the results with an asterisk (\*).

#### Notes on disqualified and excused juror race data

Population data is from the U.S. Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program, Annual County Resident Population Estimates by Age, Sex, Race, and Hispanic Origin: July 1, 2018.

Jurors self-identify their race and ethnicity on the juror questionnaire, sent to all summoned jurors.

Summoned jurors are drawn at random from the juror source list. Everyone registered to vote in Minnesota, all holders of a Minnesota driver's license, and all holders of a Minnesota state ID card are included in the source list.

Summoned jurors are disqualified or excused from service for a limited number of reasons (e.g. felony conviction/civil rights not restored, not a citizen of the United States). See Minn. Gen. R. Prac. 808.

Jurors may have more than one answer on their questionnaire which disqualifies them from service, but a single reason is entered in the jury management system; reasons are shown (left to right) in the priority order in which they are entered.

Note that jurors may be summoned more than once in the 2018-2019 period, and are included in these results each time they are summoned.

The rate of missing race data varies among disqualified, excused, and pool jurors, and is included in these results.

To protect juror confidentiality, juror race is suppressed where the results could identify the race of individual jurors. Suppression is used when there are fewer than 10 jurors or when all jurors are of the same race. Suppression is indicated with an asterisk (\*).

Summoned grand jurors are drawn at random from the juror source list. Everyone registered to vote in Minnesota, all holders of a Minnesota driver's license, and all holders of a Minnesota state ID card are included in the source list.

Jurors self-identify their race and ethnicity on the juror questionnaire, sent to all summoned jurors.

The jury pool in these results includes all jurors who report to the courthouse for grand jury duty.
